"How Lovely is Thy Dwelling Place, O Lord of Hosts!"

Many of you may have noticed the beautiful candle wall sconces located in both the main Sanctuary and Chapel. I've been researching the history of our beloved church, spending several hours pouring over the *Shiloh and Beyond, A History of the First United Methodist from 1870-1970*. Vintage church architecture is a passionate hobby of mine. If walls could talk, oh the life they have witnessed, and in this case, oh the magnificent moments of worship they have witnessed. It was my hope that I could glean just a little information about these wall sconces, which I did not find. However, I did have the opportunity to read about the carvings of the shields of the twelve apostles on the reredos in the Chancel above the altar!

I digress...in the first photo below, you will see a close-up of the original candle inserts that were installed in the Sanctuary sometime during the 1950's. After extensive searching to find replacement parts for these, the Trustees knew that someone would have to come up with a way to refurbish them completely. The original lights were not the typical socket, screw in light bulb that we are familiar with. They were one full piece with a tiny candle bulb that was a part of the whole cylinder.

Thanks to Bill Payseur and his mighty band of helpers, Letha Payseur, Marshall Dilling and Robert Dilling, the refurbishment in the Sanctuary is complete. How delightful it is to see these candle wall sconces burning brightly once again! If you will notice in the photos below, the way they create a scallop of light on the wall, and it is so charming.

If you happen to see these amazing servants, Bill, Letha, Marshall and Robert, please thank them for the way they have ministered to our church.


Spark: Finding Your Next Most Faithful Step






Prayer Pause


Sabbath



Embrace - 12 Daring Women of the Bible



Dear First UMC Church Family,

In April, when we announced that Pastors Justin and Melissa would be returning, we shared "It will look a little different but stay tuned!" We are excited to now share the details of changes the SPRC has made with you, ones that we believe honor the gifts God has given to both Pastors Justin and Melissa.

Pastor Melissa will now serve as our Lead Pastor of Connection, Mission, and Outreach. In her role, we have agreed that she will take primary responsibility for designing and implementing different ways of establishing and sustaining connections within the First UMC family, including creating a New Member Journey process, driving the membership audit and updating our Shelby software, and serving as a "connecter" across ministries and guiding First UMC members and attendees toward opportunities for mission, growth, and outreach. She will oversee and strengthen systems to sustain the vision for missional engagement in our community and the world. Pastor Melissa will be the primary pastor providing support to our Evangelism, Mission, and Outreach committee and the new Hospitality committee in 2026.

Pastor Justin will now serve as our Lead Pastor of Worship, Care, and Administration. In his role, we have agreed that he will provide pastoral leadership related to all worship services, serve as primary preaching pastor, and oversee the systems of our care and nurture ministries in partnership with other staff. In the area of Administration, Pastor Justin will be the primary pastor providing support to our administrative committees.

Pastors Justin, Melissa, and Preciouse will continue to provide pastoral care, leadership, and support as a team. Together, they will lead in prayer and worship, offer care through hospital and home visits, and respond to other congregational needs. They will continue to serve in various leadership roles during our worship services, helping guide and enrich our time together.

We are grateful for our Director of Children's Ministries, Margaret Smith. Beginning September 1, 2025, we are thrilled that Margaret will be expanding her leadership in her current role from a part-time to full-time staff member. This will provide the capacity for our children's ministry to grow and continue to remain a vital part of the discipleship journey offered here at First UMC.

In the coming weeks, we will release additional videos with more detailed information about these changes. We encourage you to watch them as they become available. As always, we are grateful for your prayers, support, and partnership in ministry.

This event is being held to raise awareness & funds to end Alzheimer's.





Financial Report

Year to Date Financial Results

Total spending through July 2025 was \$1,219,010 (\$41,689 less than budget). Total revenue in the same period was \$1,090,495 (\$24,390 more than budget). Consolidated cash flow was \$128,515.00 negative (Kitchen/Food Service was \$1,582 positive, Preschool was \$2,532 negative, and Church Operations was \$127,565 negative). 

If you have just one hour a week to spare, you can help change a life by supporting individuals on their journey to becoming confident readers.

1. Volunteer to Assist Adult Learners

The Gaston Literacy Council is in need of volunteers to work with adults who are seeking to improve their reading skills. Volunteers are asked to give just one hour per week—a small gift of time that can make a tremendous difference in someone's life.

2. Become a Reading Soul Mate

The Reading Soul Mates (RSM) program is a preventative initiative that pairs volunteers with second grade students who need extra support with literacy. Volunteers are paired with one or two children who will be their "reading buddy" for the entirety of the school year, and requires only 30 to 60 minutes of your time each week. Volunteers will need to complete a single training session (1.5-2 hours) and the program will begin late September or October and finish in April. 
