#### Flu Clinics - Oct. 8 & Nov. 12

First UMC is hosting flu clinics in the Family Life Center on October 8 and November 12 from 4:30-6:30 p.m.

#### October 8:

- Flu vaccine available for those 12 and older
- Flu shots are free for those with insurance
- Without insurance, cost is \$30 for the low dose flu (under 65) and \$100 for high dose flu (65 years and older)
- COVID shot available to those over 65 years old without a prescription
- COVID vaccine available to those over 18 years old, if they meet criteria

#### November 12:

- All flu and COVID vaccines offered on October 8 will be available
- Pneumonia and shingles vaccines will also be available

Total spending through August 2025 was \$1,407,678 (\$29,890 less than budget). Total revenue in the same period was \$1,315,789 (\$87,138 more than budget). Consolidated cash flow was \$91,889 negative (Kitchen/Food Service was \$6,376 positive, Preschool was \$2,436 positive, and Church Operations was \$100,701 negative).
