## **Did Jesus Really Say That: February 18 – March 22**

We live in a world shaped by algorithms and filters—where we curate what we see, choose which voices to trust, and often hear only what reinforces what we already believe. Over time, that way of seeing can quietly reshape not only our view of the world, but our understanding of God as well. Without realizing it, we can reduce Jesus to a version that feels familiar, comfortable, or convenient. In this series, "Did Jesus Really Say That," we return to the words of Jesus themselves—honest, challenging, and sometimes unsettling. Stripped of cultural assumptions, soundbites, and popular misquotes, we listen again for the truth Jesus came to reveal about God, about ourselves, and about what it truly means to follow Him. Using the language of our digital age—where memes, slogans, and half-truths travel fast—this series confronts common misconceptions and invites us to encounter Jesus as He actually speaks. Along the way, we may discover that His words are both more demanding and more life-giving than we ever imagined.

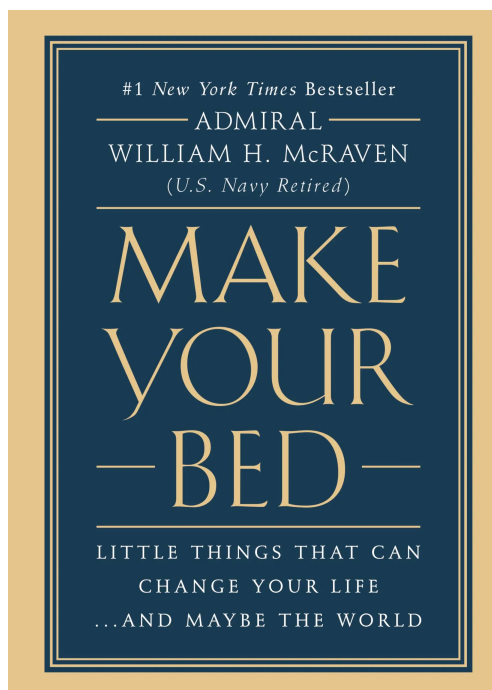
## Prayer Pause



## Year-End December 2025 Financial Results

Great news, FUMC! Our church is in a solid and stable financial situation. Here are some bright spots from 2025:

1. FUMC funded every ministry and mission that was budgeted for in 2025 by the staff and committees.
2. Collectively, our congregation was able to eliminate 100% of our debt and save our church hundreds of thousands of dollars in interest expense over the term of the note.
3. Our church has had a financial surplus over budget for the past two years.
4. Your finance committee and staff remained committed to transparency and open communication with our congregation through announcements and our monthly newsletters.
5. Your finance committee met consistently over the course of the past two years and our church is on a financially stable path.
6. We have a 2026 plan to further stabilize the foundation of the church with legacy giving and general endowment fund rebuilding plans.
7. We will be assessing our traditional stewardship campaign strategies and improving them to meet the changing needs of our congregation and increased online worship.

### The Year-to-Date numbers for 2025 were:

Total spending :	\$2,128,553 (\$22,583 <u>less</u> than budgeted)
Total revenue (income) :	\$2,250,803 (\$219,323 <u>more</u> than budgeted).

As we work through the changes in our Kitchen/Food Service ministry, we were over budget by \$8,234.  
Our thriving Preschool ministry was \$6,554 positive.

This gave us a year-to-date total for Church Operations of \$123,930 to the good. If you desire additional information, please do not hesitate to contact Dave Davis in our Church Business Office.

Your continued support of our Church is deeply appreciated. FUMC Gastonia is actively carrying out our ministries and missions throughout the year. Please make every effort to make your donations as early as possible during the year. Thank you for being a valued member of First UMC!

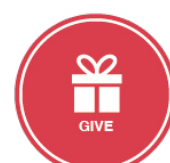
