Note from our Lead Pastors

January is also a wonderful time to reconnect:

- Try a new Sunday School class or small group.
- Say yes to serving in a ministry or outreach.

Most of all, begin this year asking, “Lord, what would You have me do?”— and trust that God will meet you with courage and joy. Ordinary People, Extraordinary Discipleship

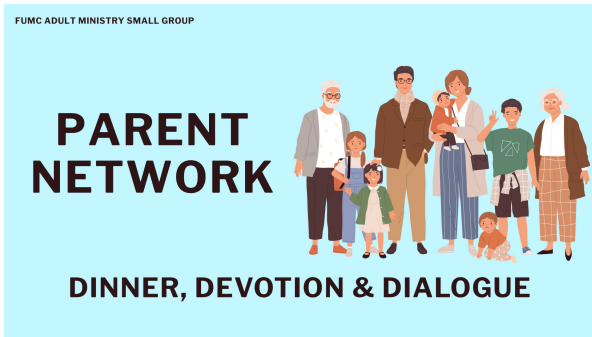
As we step into a new year, I am reminded by Diana Butler Bass that as Christians we began our new year with Advent. The Liturgical calendar can keep us tethered to our roots and faith tradition, but we must intentionally contrast it with the flow of the calendar year. Jesus first followers found sacred time and human time confusing. Even after the gift has arrived there is still more waiting. Waiting for the gifts of the magi, peace on earth, the season of Lent and the resurrection. We wait for a new heaven and a new earth.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

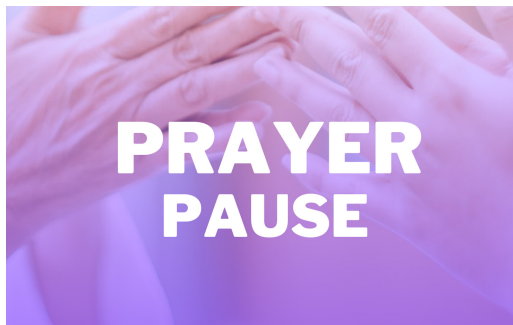

Prayer Pause

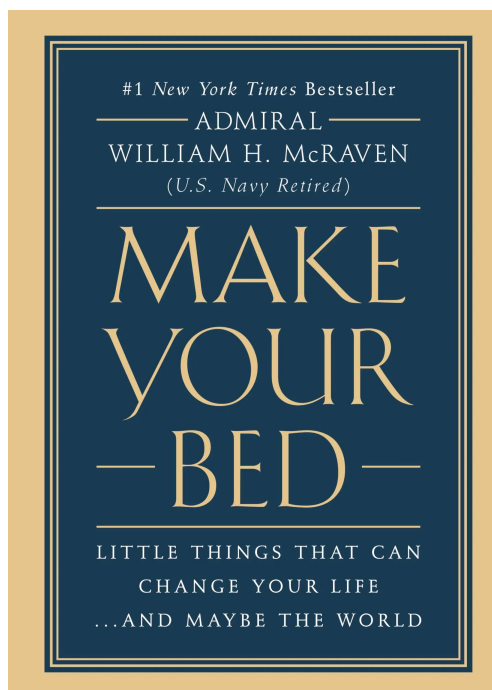

Each year, the Community Health Ministry identifies a word that becomes the theme for the programs, events and outreach. Year-to-Date November 2025 Financial Results

The following is a summary of First United Methodist Church of Gastonia's financial position through November 2025.

Total expenses year-to-date were \$1,960,874, which is \$9,203 under budget. Total revenue for the same period was \$1,883,809, exceeding the budget by \$150,684. Consolidated cash flow reflects a net negative position of \$77,065, primarily due to the timing of expenses and contributions across ministry areas. Church Operations accounts for \$73,295 of this variance, Kitchen/Food Service reflects \$5,948 negative, and Preschool continues to operate positively at \$2,178 above expenses. The ministries and mission of First UMC Gastonia continue throughout the year—serving our community, nurturing faith, and sharing the love of Christ in tangible ways. Your faithful generosity makes this ongoing work possible. As we look ahead, contributions made earlier in the year help support consistent ministry funding and operational stability. If you have questions or would like additional information, the Church Business Office is always glad to assist. Thank you for your continued support and partnership in ministry as a part of our church family at First United Methodist Church of Gastonia.

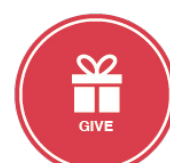
