Ephesians 4:4-7, 11-16 (NRSV)

4 There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism, 6 one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. 7 But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. 11 The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. 14 We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. 15 But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, 16 from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

As many of you probably know, a mule is a cross between horse and a donkey. The reason people cross these two animals is because a horse is smart and a donkey is strong. Cross breeding a horse and a donkey delivers the perfect work animal, smart and strong.

Mules are also stubborn and sterile. They cannot reproduce. In many ways, this describes the 21st century church especially when we fail to recognize people's gifts and equip them for ministry. Doing the same thing that we have done for years and taking care of our own at the expense of being externally focused develops a membership mentality rather than a discipleship/mission-oriented Body of Christ. In other words, too many of our churches have become stubborn and sterile.

When churches acknowledge the work of the Holy Spirit, they become vibrant and the Body of Christ is expanded and reproduced over and over again. Vibrant Christians equip others who in turn produce new believers and on and on it goes. Equipping churches become catalysts for an apostolic movement that can change communities and the world.

Paul's vision for the church wasn't just for the people of Ephesus, it was for all of God's people. Paul wanted the followers of Jesus to grow up and be mature Christians making a difference in their communities and the world. He wanted them to use their gifts to change people's lives and make disciples.


God is giving us a chance to grow up. He is asking us to be really good at one thing, making disciples. We are at a turning point in the life of the church. Will we make disciples or will we be stubborn and sterile. The future of the church is dependent on our choice.
