Summer Reads

Happy July! We hope your summer has been filled with moments of rest, connection, and joy. Whether you've been traveling, enjoying time at home, or just trying to stay cool, we want to invite you to make space this month for something refreshing for your soul: God's Word. John Wesley would describe himself as homo unius libri, "a man of one book." He was referencing that while he read broadly, one book is what shaped his life – The Bible.

This summer, we're diving into a sermon series called "Summer Reads: The Book of James." James is short—just five chapters—but it's packed with practical wisdom, powerful encouragement, and bold challenges for how we live our faith each day. It's the kind of book that doesn't just ask, "What do you believe?"—it asks, "How are you living what you believe?"

James reminds us that faith is not just something we think about—it's something we live out. Whether it's controlling our words, caring for those in need, or seeking wisdom in difficult times, James meets us where we are and points us toward the kind of life that reflects the love and grace of Jesus.

This month, we want to encourage you to do two things:

- 1. Read James with us—not just on Sunday, but throughout the week. Take a few verses each day and ask, "How can I live this out today?" This might be the Holy Spirit's agenda for you for the day!
- 2. Invite someone to worship—whether they're new to faith, returning after a long time, or just curious. James is a great book for people who want to see what a real, active faith looks like.

Our prayer is that this series will be more than just a summer routine—it will be a summer of renewal. Let's lean into God's Word together and allow it to shape our hearts, our homes, and our habits.

Don't forget that in July, our summer worship begins with Modern Worship at 9:00 am in the Theatre, 10 am Sunday School, and 11 am Traditional Worship.

We're so grateful to be on this journey with you. Let's keep growing, serving, and shining together.





Lisa Marisiddaiah (FUMC Faith Community Nurse) participated in & represented the Community Health Ministry at two recent events.

April 29th- NC MedAssist Executive Luncheon had more than 800 people in attendance and met a fundraising goal of \$250,000. This equates to more than 1,086 North Carolinas receiving support from NC MedAssist.

April 26th- PanCAN PurpleStride Charlotte Region- 5K - Group efforts raised 90% of its \$280K goal to put an end to Pancreatic Cancer.

Operation Fan Heat Relief 2025

Operation Fan Heat Relief

2025 is upon us. Thanks to the donations made by Duke Energy Foundation, Gaston County will have a finite amount of boxed fans to donate to Gaston County residents that meet the below eligibility requirements.



Why is this program

important? As individuals age and develop chronic medical conditions, they are less likely to sense and respond to changes in temperature. They also may be taking medications that can worsen the impact of extreme heat. Operation Fan Heat Relief helps vulnerable adults at risk for heat-related illnesses and stay safe in the summer.



Operation Fan Heat Relief 2025 Eligibility Requirements:

Must be 60 years old or older OR an adult with a disability that worsens with heat.

Must reside in Gaston County

Must have a home situation where a threat to health or well-being exists related to summer heat

Financial Report

Year to Date May 2025 Financial Results

Total spending through May 2025 was \$884,824 (\$6,873 less than budget). Total revenue in the same period was \$778,325 (\$29,942 more than budget). Consolidated cash flow was \$106,499 negative (Kitchen/Food Service was \$3,503 positive, Preschool was \$4,996 positive and Church Operations was \$114,998 negative.) 
