STUDY GUIDE

Read Exodus 32:1-14

Each person share about one of the following questions:

- What did you like about this passage?
- What didn't you like or made you uncomfortable about this passage?
- What didn't you understand about this passage?
- What does this passage teach us about Jesus?

Read Exodus 33:1-6

- What made the Israelites humble themselves before God?
- What do you make of the thought that the Israelites didn't humble themselves until God said he would not go with them?

Aaron made the statement: "We will not see revival until we experience conviction that leads to repentance."

- Look up / Discuss what a biblical definition of conviction is.
- Why is conviction important for repentance?
- Do you think we will experience God's revival without a call to repentance?

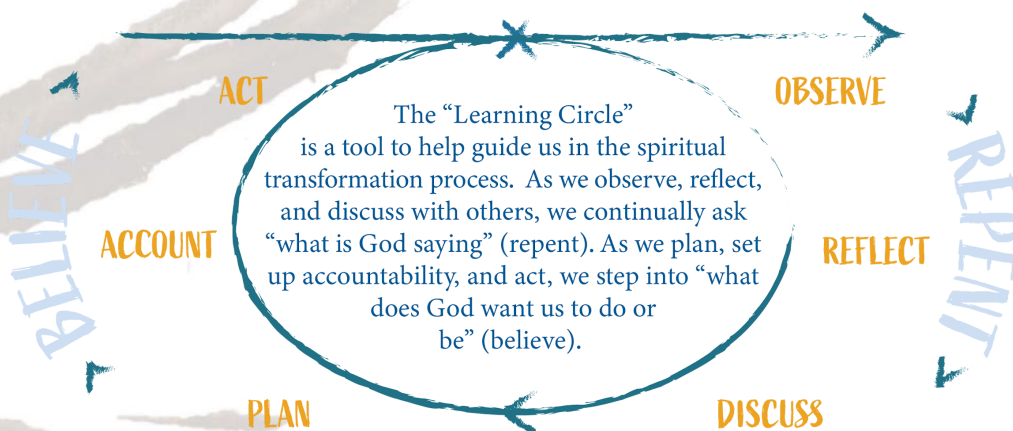
Read Psalm 139:23-24

- Spend some time in prayer asking God to "Search me and know my heart"
- Spend some time in confession before God about areas he is convicting you.
- Optional: Spend some time confessing to one another (smaller groups?)

What got your attention during the message/discussion this week?

- Why did it get your attention? (What made you mad, sad, glad or go hmm?)
- What might God be saying to you about this?
- What might God be saying to do/be about this?
- What ways do you need to step more fully into a true follower of Jesus?

Before you leave, go around and name someone in your life who needs Christ. Spend some time praying for them and for one another.
