STUDY GUIDE

Read Genesis 18:16-33

Each person share about one of the following questions:

- What did you like about this passage?
- What didn't you like or made you uncomfortable about this passage?
- What didn't you understand about this passage?
- What does this passage teach us about Jesus?

Here is a listing of what took place in this story: God revealed his purpose to destroy Sodom & Gomorrah. Abraham believed God. This broke Abraham's heart. Abraham felt God's plan needed changed. Abraham appealed to God's character and promises through bold, yet humble prayer, God changed his plan.

- Discuss this "shameless audacity" kind of prayer of Abraham.
- What does it mean that Abraham "appealed to God's character and promises"?
- Discuss how this could impact your prayer life.

Read Matthew 18:19-20, John 14:14, John 16:24

- Discuss the relevance of these verses to our prayer life.
- If belief means acting out what you know to be true: Discuss why you believe or don't believe these Bible verses.

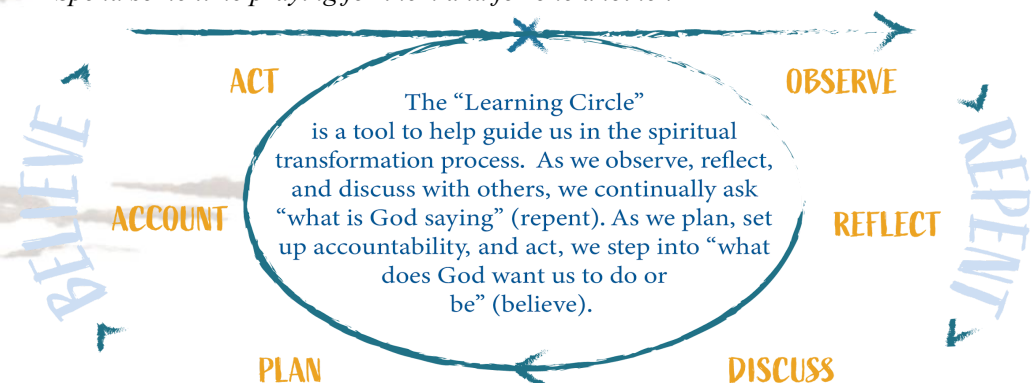
