STUDY GUIDE

Read Hebrews 11:32-34

Each person share about one of the following questions

- ☐ What did you like about this passage?
- ☐ What didn't you like or made you uncomfortable about this passage?
- ☐ What didn't you understand about this passage?
- ☐ What does this passage teach us about Jesus?

In 1 Samuel:18 and 19 (and several other chapters) Saul tries repeatedly to kill David, even though David continued to faithfully serve him.

- ☐ Have you ever had someone treat you unfairly? How did you respond to them?
- ☐ Why do you think David continued to serve Saul, even after a couple different attempts on his life? What does it tell us about his character and faith in God?

In 1 Samuel: 24 and 26 David has two separate chances to kill Saul and stop the manhunt for his life, but he chooses not to.

- ☐ Why do you think David passed up on these opportunities? Why did he go out of his way to convince others not to do anything to Saul either?
- ☐ What does this tell us about how David viewed God's timing and plans? What does it tell us about how much he still respected Saul as God's chosen?


In 2 Samuel: 5 David finally becomes king of all of Israel, as God promised.

- ☐ How can looking back on things God has already done help us persevere?
- ☐ What has God already done in your life?
- ☐ What promises of God do you feel like you are still waiting for right now?
- ☐ Where do you see those promises in Scripture?

- ☐ Why did it get your attention? (Did something made you mad, sad, glad or go hmm?)
- ☐ What might God be saying to you about this?
- ☐ What might God be saying to do/be about this?
- \square What ways do you need to step more fully into being a true follower of Jesus?
