Read John 14:15-31

Each person share about one of the following questions:

- What did you like about this passage?
- What didn't you like or made you uncomfortable about this passage?
- What didn't you understand about this passage?
- What does this passage teach us about Jesus?

Reread John 14:23-24 as well as Revelation 2:1-5

- Discuss the ways Jesus connects obedience to love
- Discuss this statement: “: God’s pattern is always grace first, then obedience second.”
- Where do you tend to slip into thinking “If I obey, then God will accept me” instead of “Because God has loved me, I obey”?

The sermon on Sunday stated that areas of disobedience point to areas where our love for Jesus is weak

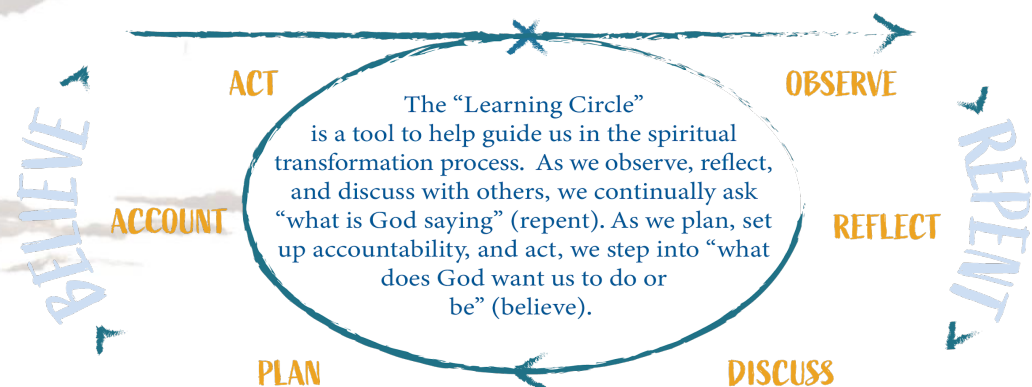
- Do you believe this statement? Why or why not?
- Is there a specific area in your life right now where obedience feels difficult?
- What might that reveal about what (or who) you're loving more than Jesus in that moment

The message talked about obedience being like a daily baptism: a daily, visible declaration of faith—not just a private belief.

- What is one way your obedience could become more “out loud” in your everyday life (time, money, relationships, priorities)?
- What makes that hard—and what would it look like to take one step this week?.

What got your attention during the message/discussion this week?

- Why did it get your attention? (What made you mad, sad, glad or go hmm?)
- What might God be saying to you about this?
- What might God be saying to do/be about this?
- What ways do you need to step more fully into a true follower of Jesus?
