- Describe the purpose of salt and light in 1st century culture.
- In your everyday life, where do you sense God calling you to preserve, influence, reveal truth, or bring hope to others?

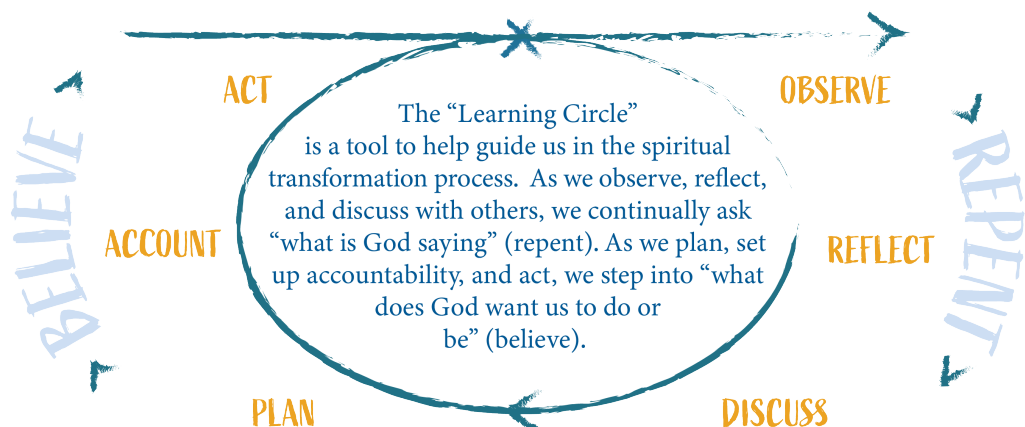
Matthew 5:6 says, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness."
