STUDY GUIDE

Read Isaiah 6:1-13

Each person share about one of the following questions

- What did you like about this passage?
- What didn't you like or made you uncomfortable about this passage?
- What didn't you understand about this passage?
- What does this passage teach us about Jesus?

In Isaiah 6, Isaiah encountered God's holiness and fell to the ground.

- When you think about God's holiness, what is your natural response—comfort, awe, distance, or something else?
- Why do you think true encounters with God often begin with a renewed awareness of His holiness rather than His usefulness?
- Where have you seen God "fill the temple" in your own life—moments where He felt undeniably holy, powerful, and real?

God asks Isaiah, "who will go for us?"

- Why do you think God chooses to involve people in His mission?
- What is the difference between feeling guilt about the lost and being moved by the heart of God for the lost?
- Which response best reflects your posture: "Here I am, but I'm not going"—Jonah, "Here I am, but I can't"—Moses, "Here I am, send me"—Isaiah
- If God is still asking, "Who will go for us?"—what do you think He is asking of you specifically?

What got your attention during the message/discussion this week?

- Why did it get your attention? (Did something made you mad, sad, glad or go hmm?)
- What might God be saying to you about this?
- What might God be saying to do/be about this?
- What ways do you need to step more fully into a true follower of Jesus?

Before you leave, go around and name someone in your life who needs Christ. Spend some time praying for them and for one another.
