STUDY GUIDE

Read Daniel 10

Each person share about one of the following questions

- What did you like about this passage?
- What didn't you like or made you uncomfortable about this passage?
- What didn't you understand about this passage?
- What does this passage teach us about Jesus?

Daniel's vision reminds us that history isn't just shaped by kings, nations, and circumstances. God reveals an unseen spiritual battle.

- What in Daniel 10 surprises you most about the unseen spiritual world?
- How does remembering there is more going on than what you can see change the way you view difficult circumstances in your own life?

The battle described in Daniel 10 is real, but Scripture consistently reminds us that Satan is a defeated enemy. We don't fight for victory; we fight from Christ's

- Which of Satan's schemes (lies, accusation, temptation, doubt, fear...) do you encounter most often? Why do you think that particular strategy is effective?
- How does knowing Christ has already won the victory give you confidence during spiritual battles?

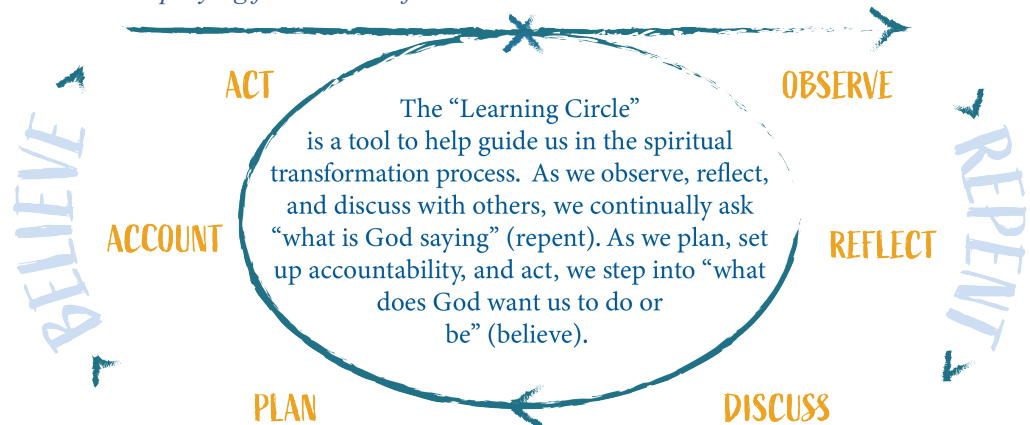
In Ephesians 6 we learned that "putting on the armor of God" is learning to live daily in Christ. Putting on the armor is putting on the presence of God

- What stood out to you about the idea that the armor of God is ultimately pointing us to Christ Himself?
- Which piece of the armor do you most need to "put on" in this season? Why?

What got your attention during the message/discussion this week?

- Why did it get your attention? (Did something make you mad, sad, glad or go hmm?)
- What might God be saying to you about this?
- What might God be saying to do/be about this?
- What ways do you need to step more fully into a true follower of Jesus?

Before you leave, go around and name someone in your life who needs Christ. Spend some time praying for them and for one another.
