NOVEMBER 23 SECOND OFFERING SUPPORTS Mexican Christian Children's Aid (MCCA) Luncheon Scheduled for MCCA presentation

The Second Offering on Sunday, November 23, will go to MCCA, Mexican Christian Children's Aid. Since 1964, MCCA has been obedient to God's call to care for children in need by supplying those in Baja California with food, scriptures and the opportunity to know the love of Christ. The River has been an active part of MCCA over the years.

On the 23rd, the Generosity and Outreach (GO) Team will be hosting a lunch after church for members to learn more and hear updates from Paul Vela, one of our members, who is serving as President of MCCA. Registration for the luncheon will be held prior to the event.



From the MCCA Website: "Approximately once every 4-5 weeks, MCCA purchases food in bulk in order to make deliveries to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja California region. We deliver the food donations primarily to facilities that operate as a 24/7 childcare center or as a daycare center, but we also make deliveries to feeding programs that attend to needy families within their own communities."

"Along with the food, Spanish translation Bibles, Gospel tracts, clothing and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all-volunteer drivers and riders who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time we go. MCCA does not own or rent a building, nor are there any paid staff. Additionally, via wise stewardship, MCCA receives cash back rewards and other means of revenue. The result is that 100% of all monetary donations goes directly to purchase food to serve those in Mexico."

REV. MOSES CHUNG TO BE AT THE RIVER SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 16

Rev. Moses Chung is The River's newest missionary. He was at The River a few months ago. He will be returning Sunday, November 16 before leaving for South Korea.



Rev. Chung is serving as Resonate Global Mission's Asian Mission Team Leader. On the CRC website, Kevin DeRaaf, director of Resonate says, "We see God's hand in leading Moses and [his wife] Eunae to South Korea to engage with church-planting efforts there and to support the work of Resonate in this critical region in the world."

Also on the CRC website, Chung says, "To his surprise and wonder he felt God calling him to mission work in Korea, where he had spent the first 15 years of his life before moving to North America.

"I have a new sense of calling in my life to leave here and do mission work in Asia, in Korea in particular. . . . I feel God has equipped and prepared me in the past 55 years of my life to do the work that's laying in front of me, and that God is inviting me to join in what God is doing already in Korea," he said.

Chung added, "I am amazed at how God led me to apply for this position—another big surprise. I am eager to see how God will reveal God's purposes through this journey, and I look forward to engaging in God's mission alongside Resonate and the Asia Mission Team."

Chung holds a master of divinity degree from Calvin Theological Seminary and a doctorate in missional leadership from Fuller Theological Seminary. He worked in parish ministry for 20 years in California, in Michigan, and in South Korea before being appointed to serve as the director of Christian Reformed Home Missions in 2011.

Expanded Men's Ministry By Cecil Miller



CarePortal Update August – September 2025

- A single mom recently got her two children back and requested two dressers. We delivered those dressers.
- The Family Services Association in Redlands website requested grocery baskets. The baskets were to help families carry their groceries from Family Services to their homes. The River delivered those grocery baskets.
- A third grader at Lugonia asked for three blankets. He told the Assistant Principal that it was hard to sleep without a blanket. He asked for three blankets because he wanted to make sure that his mom and brother also had a blanket. Three new blankets were delivered that day.
- A Lugonia family was having a difficult time battling head lice. The River Church bought and delivered three deluxe lice kits and new bedding.
- After many months the mother and children on this request were able to acquire an apartment. Unfortunately, they did not have money for beds or furniture. Thanks to Jim Nydam and Roy Null, they delivered and set up enough beds for everyone.
- A 16-year-old girl was in foster care due to her parents' substance abuse and mental health issues, she asked for help attending her homecoming dance. Despite many family challenges, this young lady does well academically and socially. The school submitting the request asked for a VISA gift card to help her buy a dress and shoes. We delivered a gift card to the school.
- After a year of diligent effort by a mother to improve her circumstances and work on healthy relationships, her 16-year-old son was able to return to her care. When he arrived, he needed personal care items like clothing and bedding. The River church was able to partner with this mom and get these items.
- A maternal aunt with four of her own biological children, agreed to care for a relative child to prevent him from being placed in a foster home. The children's mother was imprisoned for abusing this 11-year-old and his sibling. The sibling passed away from the injuries, and this young man is struggling from the loss. This young boy enjoys playing sports. The aunt requested help paying for the 11-year-old to play community sports. We paid for his fees to play football.
- CarePortal request #253436 came in on September 10. A family in Hemet recently lost their home and all their belongings due to a devastating fire. They were moving into a new

home on September 13, and they needed just about everything to start over. The household consisted of 5 adults, 5 children, and 3 dogs. Everyone was able to get out safely. Thanks to all the great donations from The River's congregation and other people in the community, we were able to fill their new home. Here is a list of items delivered: 5 beds, a couch, 2 club chairs, a crib, a stroller, pots & pans, dishes, utensils, glasses, cups, kitchen towels, bath towels, silverware, blankets, bedding, lamps, a hygiene basket, and a cleaning supply basket. They were blessed. We were blessed. God was glorified.

- The student on this request is a first grader. Unfortunately, he had accidents at school and needed adult-sized pull-ups. His mother did not have the money to purchase these items. We purchase the items requested and delivered to their home.
- A young adult living in transitional housing (former foster child), needed help with buying groceries. She is in a Medical Assistant program, and subsequently she had to reduce her hours at work.
- A young female exiting foster care and transitioning to her own apartment requested a dresser. We supplied the dresser, and it was delivered by the social worker.

Here's how Care Portal works: A child or family in need requires help from a child-serving professional. The child-serving professional vets the need and types it into CarePortal online. CarePortal alerts nearby churches and community members to needs in their area. Churches and community members partner to ensure that the child and family is helped. (Taken from CarePortal's website).

The River has been involved in CarePortal since 2018. In 2025, so far the economic impact of The River's contributions is \$73,268! Since 2018, our combined economic impact has been \$395,170! In 2025 so far 139 children and families have been served. Since 2018, that number is 865! And that does not include assistance to Lugonia students and their families.

Debbie Bueermann, Director of Outreach and Support, manages CarePortal for The River. She has a handful of people who help her with moving, pickups, and deliveries. Thank you to Deb and her team for all the great work they do and have done over the last seven years. Deb also coordinates Legacy Nights, meals for memorial services and other events, works with Women's Ministries, and a host of other things.

THANKSGIVING OFFERING

Beautiful Gate — For many years the people of The River have had a close relationship with this orphanage that ministers to HIV/AIDS infected children in Lesotho, Africa.

Benevolence (The River Deacon Fund) — enables deacons of The River to provide for financial, physical & spiritual needs of church members. It also is used to empower the Giving, Generosity & Benevolence team to share the love of God in our community locally, nationally, and globally.

Care Portal- Care Portal is an agency that brings the needs of children and families in our community to the attention of churches. Child welfare workers uncover the needs and Care Portal makes local churches aware (via email), giving churches a real-time opportunity to respond.

Christian Education Fund — provides tuition assistance to River families who send their children to local Christian schools.

Good News 4 Redlands- Good News 4 Redlands is a local volunteer, ecumenical mission distributing scriptures throughout Redlands. Their goal is to reach every one of the 25,000 homes in Redlands with a bible reader, Great Bible Truths.

Life Choice Pregnancy Resource Center— a Christ-centered ministry dedicated to the caring of women and families with pregnancy-related issues by providing them with life affirming physical, emotional and spiritual support and resources.

Lunch Bunch- Lunch Bunch is run by Ross and Sandy Cooper and welcomes those from the community who are hungry and in need of help. Everyone from infants to senior citizens are welcome. They come together for Sunday worship and a meal and hope that everyone experiences the love of Jesus while attending.

Mexican Christian Children's Aid — MCCA is a ministry obedient to God's call to care for children in need by supplying those in Baja California with food, Scriptures and the opportunity to know the love of Christ.

Oceans Ministries- Oceans Ministries believes the message and demonstration of the Father's love for us is what our world is thirsty for today. They seek to help people develop a love relationship with God the Father through publications, blogs, and mission trips, ministry in prisons and inner cities, as well as retreats, conferences, and discipleship training. Their ultimate goal is to inspire each one of us to live out our Kingdom calling in the world as sons and daughters of a loving Father.

Resonate Global Missions- Formerly Christian Reformed World Missions and Christian Reformed Home Missions, we came together in 2017 as Resonate to walk alongside Christian Reformed churches as they join God's mission in their own neighborhoods and around the world.

River Life Fund (Church's General Fund) — is approved at the annual congregational meeting in September. It makes it possible for The River CRC to do ministry locally, regionally and around the world.

Safe Families- Serves families who lack social networks and live in isolation without support of family and friends dealing with crises such as homelessness, unemployment, child abuse, domestic violence, medical emergencies and alcohol/drug rehabilitation.

Youth Hope- The organization was established in 2009 to build confidence and promote self-sufficiency for homeless, runaway, trafficked, and at-risk youth, ages 14-24, by providing trust, hope, support, and education. YouthHope was established to provide a support system for youth in a safe and caring environment so they may grow to be healthy, self-sustaining adults.

World Renew- An organization that joins with the world's families to change the story of hunger, poverty, and illness. For more than 60 years, hundreds of thousands of people have shared in this calling: staff, local partners, global communities. Every day, people give in response to a disaster, offer monthly support to Free A Family from poverty, or travel with our volunteer teams to help renew hope firsthand.
