#### WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

\*CALL TO WORSHIP The England Family

Advent begins with a watchful heartbeat—a season of waiting, of holy expectation, of leaning forward into the promise of God. We gather to keep watch, not with fear but with hope, not with anxiety but with longing love.

## We wait for the One who is already near.

The God we meet in Jesus is a God of compassion, of righteousness, and of a radical love like no other. The God who created the heavens and the earth becomes flesh and dwells among us, and the Bethlehem baby is God with us.

## Advent is about waiting. Waiting is hard, especially when we wait for Christmas.

Just four weeks from now, we will celebrate the astounding mystery of God's love made flesh—love that took on skin and bone, love that cried in a manger, love that came not in splendor but in vulnerability. Advent reminds us that God's love chooses unlikely places and unexpected people.

## We wait for our Hope to be born in us again.

Today, we light the first candle of Advent – the Candle of Hope. We light it in gratitude for God's perfect love made visible in Christ, and in humility for our imperfect, sometimes clumsy attempts to share that love. We light it as a sign that even now, in our waiting with hope, God's light shines in the darkness. The darkness did not overcome it, and the dark never will.

(As the first candle is lit, sing Verse One of O Come, O Come Emmanuel.)

O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

God of Advent, we confess that we are impatient people: quick to move, fast to worry, and slow to wait. Teach us to keep watch for signs of your love and hope breaking in. As we keep watch, prepare our hearts for Christ's return. In the name of Jesus, Emmanuel, God-with-us, let us worship God.
