

3rd Sunday in Advent Service of Lessons & Carols December 14, 2025

Advent marks the beginning of the new Christian year. It is a time to prepare for the One who is coming to us, both as the Incarnate Word at Christmas and as the Judge and Redeemer who comes again at the end to establish God's realm of peace and justice. Our call is to prepare the world for Christ's coming now and in the end time. The color is blue for royalty, a sign of the coming King.

A Word About Lessons & Carols

The tradition of interspersing short "lessons" with carols began in the town of Truro, England, in the late nineteenth century. Drawing on the ancient monastic office of Matins (a form of sung prayer), an order of nine lessons interspersed with familiar carols was created. Eric Milner-White, Dean of King's College Cambridge, felt that the Church of England could benefit from a new form of worship and adapted this earlier 19th century lessons service for the traditional Christmas Eve service at King's College Chapel in 1918.

During Christmas, surrounded by family and friends, we often feel the warmth of knowing we belong—here, in this place, with these people.

Yet we remember that not everyone feels that joy and warmth this time of year.

This season brings both highs and lows, joy and weariness, rushing when we long to stand still. Even in the Christmas story, opposites meet.

Angels from on high announce good news to shepherds who are the least and the overlooked, yet they are the first to hear of Christ's birth.

Through Isaiah, we hear, "He tends his flock like a shepherd; He gathers the lambs in His arms and carries them close to His heart." God gathers Bethlehem's least—and gathers us.

In Advent, we remember we belong to God. All are welcome, and none are shut out.

Today, we light the third candle—the Candle of Joy—remembering that God's joy reaches into every corner of our lives and every kind of heart.

We light this candle because we belong, because God's light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it.

A very long time ago, God said, "Let there be light."

And there was light.

(As the third candle is lit, sing Verse One of O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.)

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Isreal, that mourns in lowly exile here until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Isreal.

God of Advent, you are the Light of the world. In you, there is no darkness at all. There are no outcasts, no one who is not good enough; all have a place at the table. As we journey through Advent, help us remember those whom the world forgets, you welcome with joy and open arms. In the name of Jesus Christ, let us worship God.
