Advent is a season of longing – a place to belong and a place where we can find peace. Last week, we remembered those searching and hoping for a home. Today, we hear John the Baptist calling from the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; make (God's) paths straight." Repentance is our way to make room for Christ. Repentance is the way we come home and realize we belong to God.

We wait for the One who makes our hearts His home.

Matthew tells us John proclaimed, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." Repentance is not rejection; it is return. Even in our wilderness places, God, through the Prince of Peace, is preparing a way home.

We turn our hearts toward God, who always turns toward us.

We light this second candle remembering that not all have peace, and we remember all who long for it — for the weary, the wandering, and all who seek God's path that leads to shalom. We light it as a reminder that God's light shines in every darkness.

(As the second candle is lit, sing Verse One of O Come, O Come Emmanuel.)

O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

God of Advent, prepare our hearts for the Prince of Peace. Clear what clutters our lives, and as we prepare our homes, help us make room within us for Christ, our true home and our true peace. Draw us closer to your light as we draw closer to Christmas. In the name of Jesus Christ, let us worship God.
