History of First Presbyterian Church, Franklin, Tennessee

~ A Brief History ~

On June 8, 1811, the Presbyterian Church of Franklin was organized with 46 members by the Reverend Gideon Blackburn. Its first location fronted on present-day Fourth Avenue. About 1815, a Meeting House was erected at that location, now on the northern part of the Old Cemetery.

The second location of the church, which was a brick structure on the corner of Fifth and Main Street, was purchased in 1841. Then in November 1864, immediately after the Battle of Franklin, the sanctuary was dismantled and occupied by the Federal Army for use as a hospital. The third sanctuary was erected in 1887 and destroyed by fire in 1905. The fourth sanctuary was erected in 1911.

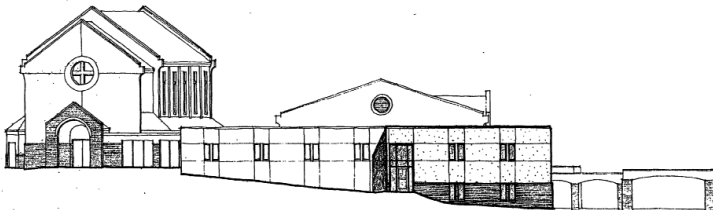
In 1986, the Presbytery of Middle Tennessee did a study to project population growth and determine new church development needs. Williamson County (Franklin) emerged as the focal point. As a result, the congregation voted to purchase twelve acres of property on Franklin Road at Mack Hatcher and to build adequate facilities at the earliest feasible date.

In August 1994, approximately 500 members moved to its third and present location at Franklin Road and Legends Club Lane. On September 18, 1994, this building was dedicated to the glory of God, continuing a history of Reformed worship, Christian education, and local and global mission. In November 2015, the church paid off its mortgage and became debt free.

The power of the church, however, is not in its buildings, but in the people who meet in it, the Body of Christ. We are grateful and excited for all God is doing through the church that gathers in this place.

CHURCH GOVERNMENT

First Presbyterian Church is governed by a Session composed of 15 Ruling Elders. Elders serve on rotating three year terms with 5 members in each class. The incoming class is elected by the congregation in the summer of each year. The Session regularly meets at 4:00 PM on every 4th Sunday except for June and December. When new members are ready to join, the Session schedules a called meeting on Sundays at 9:50 AM in the Parlor, Room 218.

WORSHIP

SUNDAYS AT 10:15 AM

Our congregation gathers weekly for worship on Sunday mornings at 10:15 AM. Evening worship is celebrated on special occasions during the year such as Ash Wednesday, Lent mid-week, Maundy Thursday, Service of Light, and Christmas Eve Candlelight. Sunday worship is livestreamed on our website at fpcfranklin.org along with previous services.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper is celebrated on the first Sunday of each month and on special occasions such as World Communion Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Christmas Eve. It is also celebrated during Lent weekly as a part of the Wednesday evening services.

ACOLYTES

CHILDREN'S WORSHIP

Children are welcome to remain in the sanctuary for the entire worship service, and we have a Time with the Young Church during worship each week for all children. At the conclusion of the Time with the Young Church, our fours, fives, and kindergartners have the option of attending Children's Worship.

Children's Worship leaders meet the children in the Narthex (space right outside the Sanctuary) and take them to Room 101 in our Children's Wing. Leaders bring them back to the Sanctuary after the sermon where they rejoin their families for the remainder of the service.

Children's Worship provides a time for our younger children to be more actively engaged as they worship (Bible story, activity, prayer) on their developmental level.

COMMON GROUNDS

Our church strives to provide spaces where all are welcomed and known. Join us for Common Grounds from 9:45-10:15 AM each Sunday morning for coffee, snacks, and community time. We offer food options and emphasize environmentally friendly practices. This is a time for members and guests to connect with one another.

Throughout the three-year cycle, each lesson comes from a Bible story in the Old Testament, the Gospels, or Acts that the children will hear during worship.

Confirmation Preparation (6th grade or above)

Students at First Presbyterian Church can enroll in confirmation when they reach the 6th grade or older. The course begins with an understanding of Scripture and includes information about the Reformed tradition, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and First Presbyterian Church Franklin. Our main curriculum is “Big God, Big Questions.” In addition to regular lessons, Confirmands are assigned a Covenant Partner to walk beside them in their journey. Confirmands and Covenant Partners read the Gospel of Luke then meet at least twice monthly to discuss their reading, explore other questions of the faith, and offer service to the community.

Our youth curriculum is *Feasting on the Word*, published by Westminster John Knox Press, and following the *Revised Common Lectionary*. Each week’s lesson comes from a Bible story that is also referenced in worship. Over the course of the lectionary’s three-year cycle, youth will read a variety of stories from both the Old Testament and the New Testament, with one of the synoptic gospels (*synoptic* is a word used to describe the first three gospels in the New Testament, as they all tell the story of Jesus Christ’s life and ministry from a similar point of view and are similar in structure) as the focus of each year: Year A – Matthew, Year B – Mark, and Year C – Luke. The gospel of John is read each year, primarily in Christmas, Lent, and Easter.

Chancel Choir (Adult and High School)

Casavant, Opus 3839 (2020)

The sanctuary pipe organ, Casavant Freres Opus 3938 (2020), was built by Casavant Freres Limitée of St. Hyacinth, Quebec, Canada and contains 1,515 pipes over two manuals and pedal. The instrument was built by one of the longest lived organ companies in the world and contains 15 sets of historic vintage pipework. Built by Casavant in 1910, these pipes were created for their Opus 440, an instrument formerly housed in the Church of St. Phillip, Three Rivers, Quebec. A gift of two generous donors, the organ will proudly lead the worship of this congregation for generations to come.

Schulmerich Carillon (2020)

The digital carillon, also a gift of two generous donors, chimes the hour daily; rings prior to and after worship; and gives voice to a daily hymn program at Noon and 6PM.

~ Mission Ministry ~

The Mission Ministry seeks to demonstrate God's saving grace by serving others in our community, nation, and world. Our aim is to learn about and work toward justice, peace, and reconciliation in our world.

Mission Partners

FPC currently provides financial and volunteer support to the following: Room In The Inn, Hard Bargain Association, GraceWorks, Brightstone, Habitat for Humanity, Williamson County Homeless Alliance, Feed America First, Meals on Wheels, Bridges, My Friend's House, BRA Foundation, Jiselle Lauren Foundation, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, Society of St. Andrew, and UKirk. Throughout the year, we collect "Basic Essentials" for the GraceWorks Food Pantry. In addition, we sponsor a monthly "extra" collection for various organizations.

We sponsor quarterly blood drives for the American Red Cross. We provide space for our Boy Scout Troop. Other activities include collecting gifts for GraceWorks Manger Tree and Christmas Gift Baskets for families.

Domestic and Disaster Relief

Each year we send at least one mission team to areas in need in the United States. Recently teams travelled, fall and spring, to Mountain T.O.P. in Coalmont, TN, to participate in their Adult in Ministry Weekend. Teams helped with home repairs and their Fall Festival. Teams also went, spring and fall, to Dixon Springs, TN, to serve Crossroads Mission Care, a retreat center for First Responders. Locally, we participated in the Inside and Out Work Day with the Hard Bargain Association.

In previous years, we have worked with and stayed alert to needs in the United States through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) and the Appalachian Service Project (ASP). FPC also sponsors a Martin Luther King Intergenerational Service Learning Project each year in January.

Global Missions

FPC has a long history of global mission work, going back to our own member, Lena Reynolds, who served as a missionary in Africa for 32 years, from 1932 to 1959.

Currently, we financially support three global mission partners: Living Waters of the World, The Outreach Foundation, and the Guatemala-Peten Partnership Task Force of the Presbytery of Middle Tennessee. We also plan global mission trips as appropriate. Our most recent trip was to Cuba in 2024. Previous global trips included Mozambique, Lebanon, Greece, and Mexico.

FPC Intergenerational Service in Hope (FISH)

A select number of mission activities are designated as FISH. These are mission efforts that focus on bringing together members of all ages to serve together. There is an emphasis on teaching our youngest the importance of serving others and to help everyone establish relationships with others of differing ages.

Recent FISH activities have included (1) assembly of teacher appreciation bags for our United for Hope school, assembly of snack packs for Room In The Inn, and assembly of emergency buckets, school kits, and hygiene kits for PDA Gifts of the Heart; (2) assembly of bags and seed packets for Society of St. Andrews; (3) serving meals to the homeless at Downtown Presbyterian Church, to the Guest house residents at Room In The Inn, and to the UKirk students; (4) participating in a sweet potato drop with the Lions Club; (5) volunteer work at the Williamson County Animal Center; (6) distributing food for the GraceWorks Mobile Food Pantry. A new and upcoming FISH activity will include a Rise Against Hunger event in Fall of 2026, where we will package shelf stable meals to be delivered to areas with food scarcity outside of the United States.

Future Plans for Mission Ministry
