"Oh When the Saints"

Before we take time to honor those in the armed services on Veterans Day or gather around Thanksgiving tables to fellowship with loved ones and eat our fill, there is another November holiday that comes and goes with little fanfare: All Saints' Day.



This ancient tradition far predates the PCUSA and Reformed tradition, and while we don't canonize saints like our Catholic brothers and sisters, we do give thanks and honor for the lives of fellow believers in this day and age and in ages long passed.

We generally use this holiday to commemorate the deceased, and FPC has an All Saints' banner that grows every year as we remember and celebrate the lives of those who are near and dear to us. I also appreciate how, weekly, in our Prayers of the People, we take a moment to remember and name the saints who have gone before us on the anniversary of their deaths. Grief does not stay behind in the year we lost our loved one, and the continual remembrance of our saints breathes new life into our memories of their love and wisdom.

Do our saints have to be deceased? I certainly see many saintly people when I look around the congregation on any given Sunday. A practice that we incorporate into our Confirmation program is encouraging our Confirmands and their Covenant Partners to meet together with a "saint of the church," a member who has given many years to FPC and who has wisdom to share about faith and life. It's a beautiful assignment that connects the generations, for there is so much that we can learn from each other without waiting for a funeral or memoir.

Before the holidays arrive in full force, I invite you to reflect upon the saints in your life, both those who have gone on to glory and those that remain in our midst. How might we celebrate their legacy this month? What words of gratitude could you share to show them how much their Christian witness has meant to you?

May we all live lives worthy of being called saintly some day!
