STAFF REFLECTION ANNE KEENER, COMMISSIONED PASTOR

"May we, to whom much has been given, open our hearts and pay attention to where God is leading us to generously respond to God's grace with gratitude." This was the last sentence of the sermon I preached yesterday, and it is still on my heart as I sit on my back porch this morning writing the article.




