




STAFF REFLECTION EDDIE BELLIS, INTERIM PASTOR

To my friends and fellow believers at FPC,

On behalf of the Pastoral Transition Team (PTT), I want to encourage you to complete the survey titled "Church Assessment Tool" or CAT. The survey completion takes an average of 25 minutes. The survey makers are looking for your first impressions. Once completed, the Session and Transition Team will receive a review of the report from "Holy Cow! Consulting" in mid-to-late September, and we scheduled a Wednesday Night Live presentation of the results for October 29. Please mark that date, sign up for supper, and attend this important meeting in the life and ministry of FPC.



This past Sunday, Rich Crim, a Co-Moderator of the PTT, did a wonderful job introducing the PTT members during the Worship Service. If you were not able to attend, I encourage you to listen to Rich's encouraging words. What struck me in his presentation was his emphasis that the Mission Study is a congregation document, and we need your input. His words reminded me to communicate what a "Mission Study" is: its purpose and content. designed to do. If you have questions after reading this, please ask me questions.

The Mission Study's root is in Strategic Planning, and like any good plan we need to know where we are and also predict where we believe God is taking us. This includes the whole body of First Presbyterian in Franklin. Once we know those two data points, we begin to organize the data into a document called the Mission Study. The congregation survey is just one of the many items in the strategic plan.

The Table of Contents best describes what a typical Mission Study includes:

- Ministry in Community This important snapshot includes a brief history of FPC as it relates to its pastors, location, and important historical events. FPC does not exist in a vacuum. We also look to the surrounding area of Franklin, Williamson County, and its relationship to Nashville which impacts the mission and vision of FPC. We capture the demographic data through discussions with Franklin planners, past census data and through an online program called Mission Insite where we can access current religious data related to our surrounding area.
- What are our ten-year trends in both worship attendance and financial giving?
- A concise review of the key elements of the congregation survey CAT.
- A compilation and summary of the "listening sessions" that will follow your participation in the CAT. The PTT believes it will be in late October or early November when these listening sessions will occur.
- What is our current committee/organization structure and what sort of ministry programs do we offer inside our structure?
- Other items that may be unique to our local ministry's presence are also noted as important to itemize and include.

So, that is it! Currently, the PTT is working on many of these items. Once the PTT finishes its collective work, the Mission Study will be handed to the Session and Presbytery of Middle Tennessee's Committee on Ministry for their approval. At that point, we come to the important task of reporting to you the results compiled in the Mission Study. We will meet as a church to celebrate the completion of the PTT's main task and receive their work with joy.

Our last step will be the electing of a Pastor Nominating Committee that will use the Mission Study to develop our church's resume and actively interview candidates for calling the next Head of Staff for FPC Franklin.

I am happy to discuss your questions, and I want to give thanks for the PTT's ongoing work. They meet every other week (since May), and you should be proud of their curious nature and faith filled work in moving us along in this critical season. I am grateful and appreciate each person who is offering so much time and love for God's excellent work in this place called FPC.

Continue to grow in God's grace and walk in God's love.


VISITATION MINISTRY


