Greetings! It has been a hectic but energizing five months here at your church. We are celebrating the commissioning of our first ever class of Stephen Ministers and look forward to their ministry among us and in our community. We are celebrating another successful Confirmation class with three of our confirmands being baptized into full membership bringing those baptized into our church over the last two years to 23! We are celebrating a new class of young acolytes who have been commissioned to guide us in our time of worship each Sunday. We are well on our way to achieving our goal of 150 persons in Sunday morning small groups as adult classes continue to receive new participants and our children's and youth groups continue to grow as well. We recognized our high attendees (those with 75% or higher attendance in the last quarter) and it should be noted that the majority of our children and youth attended small groups over 50% of the time. I don't remember when the last time was that we could celebrate such an achievement. Although formal Wednesday evening activities will take a break over the summer months, we made many new friends that attended during the school year and we look forward to seeing them and more back in September. Bible studies, topical discussions and Emmaus reunion groups will continue to be available over the summer. Our newly designed web presence and our Facebook page are proving to be invaluable tools of communication as well as a good method for evangelism. And, we can expect a brand new electronic marquis signboard to be installed on the fellowship hall in the next few weeks to further enhance our intentional effort to reach out to others. U.M. ARMY, Vacation Bible School and youth mission trips are all planned to insure our summer months are anything but dull and routine.

Our worship continues to grow at both 8:30 and 10:45 and so does the conversation about moving forward with new sanctuary and classroom space at BUMC. In addition, the overwhelming majority of worshippers "voted" to continue offering Holy Communion every Sunday at both services and rarely does a Sunday go by that someone doesn't tell me how much it means to be able to celebrate the sacrament on a regular basis.

When I think back on my introductory meeting some 2 years ago now, I remember vividly the passion of those setting around the conference room table expressing their hopes and desires to see this church grow – not just in numbers but also in discipleship and evangelism and mission and all areas where we could proclaim the saving grace of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our neighbors in thought and word and deed. It does my heart proud to see God's people take serious our commission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world for we are growing in all areas and for this we give God all the praise and glory.

I sincerely hope that you will be a part of all that is growing and going on at your church. If you are out of the habit of participating in church or perhaps are still holding a grudge from something that happened (or didn't happen) a while ago, I encourage you to give that over to God and start a new summer regimen of regular prayer, presence, gifts, service and witness. You won't be disappointed! Bandera UMC has a place for everyone and we look forward to seeing you soon. May God continue to richly bless you and yours!

The end is near! The end of school, that is! And things in the youth wing are in full chaos mode! This past weekend, at 30-Hour Famine, the kids finished their service project of building flood buckets for UMCOR. They were able to meet their original goal of 20 fully packed buckets as well as having extra items that will be taken to the UMCOR warehouse in Kerrville to be added to their inventory to build more buckets. 13 youth participated in the Famine and it was an awesome weekend! The kids fasted for 30 hours, during which time they did service projects around the church and Bandera. All of the kids and adults who committed to participate made it the entire time. I am a very proud Youth Director!

The C.R.E.W. food drive for Helping Hand also ended on May 14th. The Youth Council set a goal of 777 pounds to be collected and donated. I am happy to say that they met their goal. Most of you have probably heard that it was promised that if they collected enough, they would be allowed to choose Bonnie's new hair color. So, keep your eyes peeled for a Rainbow-locked Youth Director running around the church in the coming weeks.

May 29th will be a busy Sunday for all our youth! The Sunday School Challenge will conclude that week, with those who have attended at least 75% of the Sundays this Spring being recognized in church, with a special recognition for those who have Perfect Attendance. We will commission our acolytes during the service. This will also be Confirmation Sunday, with each of our confirmands being recognized and joining BUMC as full members.

May 29th is a 5th Sunday worship, which means a meal follows the service, during which we will recognize all those who have graduated this year, including college and graduate school. The meal will be dedicated to our departing seniors as they embark on the next phase of their lives. We will recognize their accomplishments and offer a blessing as we send them off into the world. This year BUMC is blessed to have six seniors graduating: Rachel Brosz, Stephanie Lister, J.T. Milner, Seva Nix, Catherine Ringel, and Whitley Whitewood.

Ten C.R.E.W. members and five adults will head to the Lockhart/Martindale area in June for the UM A.R.M.Y. mission camp. Attendees will do flood cleanup and help rebuild homes around the area. Bandera UMC will also host a UM A.R.M.Y. camp in July, where approximately 80 campers will call our church "home" for the week while they work on service projects throughout Bandera County.

Summer is an exciting and busy time for our youth as they travel to camps, mission trips, and other activities. Please be in prayer for all those teens embarking on new spiritual experiences, as well as the many adults who will be there to help plan, lead, and guide them on their faith journey.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4: 6-7

Our children and youth are the future of our church and will be the face of Christianity in the years to come. This can be a very daunting idea to those trying to find their place in this world. 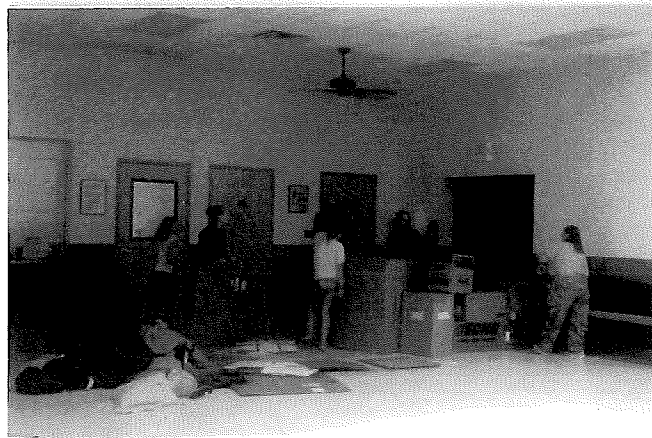
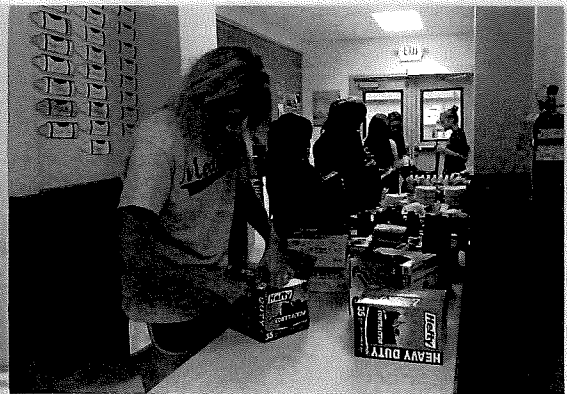

We will teach you what you need to know. Reading music is NOT a prerequisite for joining any of Bandera UMC's musical groups (neither is church membership). Join us when you are in town. We're flexible. The "age limitation" for the various groups are as follows: Chancel Choir and Praise team accept anyone who is in middle school or older; the Bandera Bells is for BUMC's middle to older youth (grades

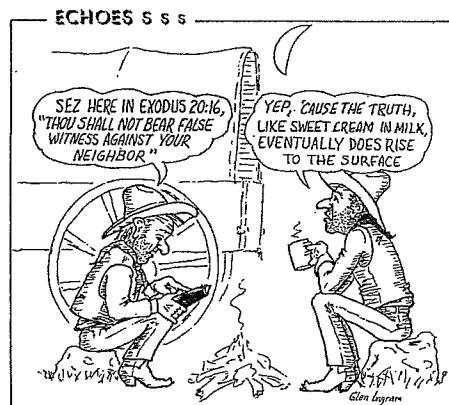
5 - 12); and the Jubilation Bell choir is for Adults and older teens.

Music only occurs when we put away our fears, open our mouth or pick up and instrument and we "make music from our heart to the Lord" (Eph. 5:19b). It is not a spectator sport. Nor is it mainly "just for ladies", gentlemen. Consequently, corporate music only happens when we join with others and raise our voices together or play instruments together as a means of "giving thanks to God the Father for everything" (Eph. 5:20a).

Music is fleeting. It only lasts for the short span of time while the sound reverberates in our ears. That which is learned with music is remembered long after most things that are learned during our lifespan in other ways have faded from our memory. This fact is the reason that hymns like "A Mighty Fortress", "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing", and "10,000 Reasons" were written. Maybe this is the reason that some of our prayers have been set to music - such as the Gloria Patri and the Doxology. In our corporate singing, we bear witness to our faith. We are a conduit for God's love, grace, and truth to flow to all who are within the sound of our song.

Beginning in July, will you let the fears go? Will you come and be part of Bandera UMC's corporate music ministry?

THE FOOT OF THE CROSS

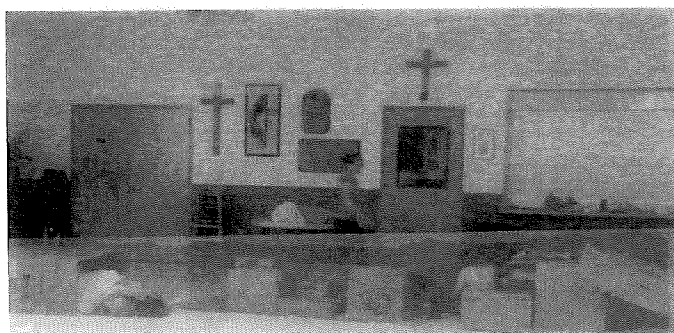
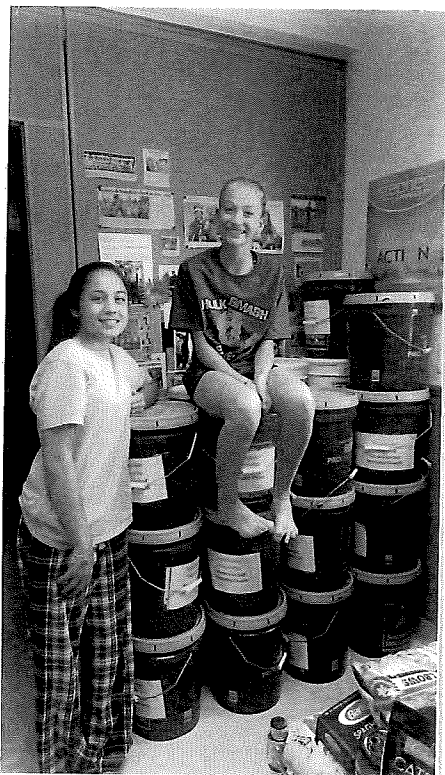
