Bandera United Methodist Church is having a very fruitful year in many ways.

On the financial front, we've been challenged with extraordinary facility repairs, maintenance, and replacement of two of the air conditioners for our Fellowship Hall. The good news is our church members' tithes, gifts, and offerings have been ample to meet our needs, handle our usual mission efforts, and help those affected by the recent hurricanes. Our income through September was \$344,721 while our expenses were \$317,664 which left us with \$27,057 as we head into our holy season.

Stephen Ministry

What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a ministry that uses the Christian community to reach out to and comfort those who are hurting, lonely, or just need friendly, ear. We've devoted 50 hours or more to our training and acquiring skills that will help us to better serve those in need. Confidentiality is as important as the compassion with which we serve. By utilizing Stephen Ministers, our Church is able to extend the amount of care and support the pastor can offer our congregation. We're caregivers who are willing and able to listen and walk alongside our care receivers through grief, crisis or other stresses in life.

Pastor Kyle has also trained us in giving Communion to those who are shut in, hospital or nursing home bound, whether long or short term. If you know someone who would like to receive Communion, but can't make it to Church or if you or someone you know would benefit from a Stephen Minister; you can call the Church office and speak with Pastor Kyle or ask that Roberta Himebrook give you a call.

Helping Hand

Helping Hand is truly blessed! Without the giving we receive from local churches, individuals, and groups we could not help those in need in Bandera County. In September alone, we helped 341 individuals, 158 families, and 10 new families. Monetary value we have given away this year through September is \$195,620.

Helping Hand thanks our local United Methodist Women for their generous soap and washcloth packets. These are used by the homeless when they use the shower facilities.

Any Thanksgiving dinner food item is our special food request for November--stuffing, canned vegetables and fruits, canned soups. Drop boxes are in the Fellowship Hall and Church Office.
