Hi there!

Thanks for allowing your child to visit our Awana® club. We know that you're concerned about your child's success in every area of life. You care about shaping values, building character, and providing tools needed for your child to develop a solid, spiritual foundation.

Because our church believes Awana effectively contributes to this journey, we have chosen to partner with them. For over 60 years Awana has been engaged in lifelong discipleship of children and the training of adults who lead them. The Awana leaders in our church are equipped to guide your kids toward a strong, biblical worldview and active lives of faith.

We are confident in partnering with Awana and it's mission to equip leaders to reach kids with the gospel and to engage them in lifelong discipleship, and we join in their vision and prayer that all children and youth throughout the world will come to know, love, and serve the Lord Jesus Christ.

What does Awana offer your child?

- Biblical teaching
- Basics for a relationship with God
- A foundation for a biblical worldview
- Ultra-fun games and activities
- Bible memorization
- Positive friendships
- Support for parents as they spiritually nurture their children
- In-club adult affirmation and encouragement
- Consistent and positive training on how to thrive in group settings
- Awards and recognition for accomplishments

We've designed a 3-part program to maximize your child's attention, energy, and time:

Activity Time - Exciting activities that allow kids to participate regardless of their skill level.

Small Group Time - No one gets lost in the crowd. Your child receives individualized attention from a caring adult leader as they work through an introductory booklet and then an age-specific activity book.

Large Group Time - An interactive large group segment where kids meet together to sing, hear a Bible lesson, and receive awards. Awana leaders go the extra mile to help your kids understand the Bible and how it applies to their lives.

Look at what your child brought home.

If you child is in Cubbies®, Sparks®, T&T®, or Trek® they brought home an entrance booklet.

Their first goal is to complete the booklet by following the directions to memorize the verses.

When your fees are paid, they'll receive a club uniform and a club handbook to begin working on.

A good goal is for your child to complete 1-2 sections per week in the handbook. Each of the 32 lessons corresponds to one of the 32 weeks that Awana meets, but your child is welcome to work at their own pace.

Helping you spiritually lead your child

Neither culture nor circumstances will ever fully define today's kids. Instead their worldview will be shaped and their path chosen by how well they come to know, love, and serve Jesus Christ.

You have the most influence on the development of a biblical worldview for your child. Our church wants Awana to be one tool for you to use as your child grows and matures. Be on the lookout for ways you can join your child in her Awana experience.

Once your child completes their entrance booklet, they will receive their club-specific handbook. The handbook is a great tool for you and your child to grow spiritually. You can help your child memorize verses, talk through sections, and read the Parent Pages.

Each handbook also includes helpful tips for parents, located either at the front or the end of each handbook.

NOTE: If your child is learning to read, your role is absolutely essential in helping them to memorize verses. Our volunteers will assist kids each week, but for some clubs, like Cubbies®, your involvement is required to progress through the handbook.

While it is certainly our desire that each child completes their workbook, please do not stress if your child "gets behind." Consistency toward spiritual growth is the real goal, and learning God's Word should be enjoyable, not a point of conflict. You can work with your child to catch back up, and there will still be plenty of opportunities for your child to earn awards that reflect everything they have achieved.

What else do I do?

Fire up your child's enthusiasm at home by:

- Modeling an interest in spiritual things. Your example and encouragement in learning about God's Word are on of the greatest influences on your child.
- Familiarizing yourself with the verses your child is learning so that you can practice and discuss them together. Even better, why not memorize them with your child?
- Seeking help from others. Do you or your child have questions about a verse or biblical concept? Ask your child's Awana leader for help. They can answer the question or direct you to someone who can.

Try these conversation starters in the car or during a meal:

- Why do you think God loves us so much?
- Do you remember the verses you said at Awana club this week?
- Can you teach this week's verse to me? (This is a great way for kids to learn the verses themselves.)
- Tell the story of your own faith. How did you come to know God?

What does Awana look like each week?

- We'll start each Wednesday at 6:00 pm and end at 7:30 pm.
- Make sure your child wears their uniform and brings their handbook. Older children are also encouraged to bring their own Bible.
- We will also have Theme Nights throughout the year when everyone dresses up or we celebrate a holiday together. We'll make sure to communicate those to you, but we've included a calendar at the back of this guide.

How do I stay in touch with what's happening?

After you register your child, you'll start receiving regular text message updates. Anyone can also sign up for them by texting @awanaibc to 81010.

Is there a health policy?

In regards to children and workers, Immanuel Baptist Church will follow all local, state, and federal health mandates. To the best of our ability, we will follow guidelines recommended by the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC).

Children should not attend if they have had any of the following symptoms in the past 24 hours:

- colored discharge from eyes, ears, or nose
- vomiting or diarrhea
- fever over 99 degrees (must be fever free for 24 hours without medication)
- rash associated with a viral or bacterial infection
- contagious illness (hand, foot, mouth, coronavirus, etc.)
- lice or nits


Workers must communicate with their ministry supervisor ASAP if a health reason will prevent them from serving when they are scheduled to serve. Workers must also communicate with their ministry supervisor if they have any reason to believe they got sick when they were serving.

Parents must communicate any allergies when children are checked-in, along with any instructions for medication, such as an inhaler or an EpiPen. Workers will administer medication only in emergency situations where allergies and medication instructions have been communicated by parents.

Parents/guardians will be texted and/or called if a child gets sick or needs their attention.

Young children 2-3 years old

Puggles® recognizes the learning ability of young children by introducing biblical precepts at church and equipping parents to teach them at home.

In Puggles, the youngest children are drawn into a great understanding of God and His love for them! Gatherings each week include play time, songs, and simple crafts and activities. Leaders present ageappropriate lessons using large, colorful teaching cards, finger puppets, and more.

Preschool Children 3-5 years old

Cubbies[®] celebrates the spiritual potential of preschoolers by helping them develop respect for God, His son, and His Word.

Preschoolers love Cubbies! Whether it's the fun puppets, the exciting games, or all their friends, they simply can hardly wait for their next Cubbies meeting. At Story Time each week, preschoolers learn so much about God! Lessons focus on the greatness of God's love, His Word, and His Son, Jesus Christ, the promised Savior. Non-competitive games build excitement and reinforce Story Time lesson themes.



Cubbies receive stickers in their book as soon as they complete their section, their review verse, and/or their parent has signed their Under the Apple Tree.

When they complete the Rank sections (the first two in their book), they receive their rank patch for their uniform.

At the end of each unit they receive a Red or Green Apple Emblem for their vest

Cubbies who complete their books will receive a book ribbon which corresponds with their book.

Kindergarten through 2nd grade

Sparks[®] ignites the curiosity of early elementary-age kids to learn about the people and events of the Bible, building a foundation of wisdom for knowing Christ.

To many children in kindergarten to second grade, Sparks is the highlight of the week! They love their red vests, the exciting games and spending time with leaders and friends.

Sparks is divided into three years with a unique rank: HangGlider®, WingRunner®, and SkyStormer®.

Each year, kids in Sparks:

- Explore the biographies of people of the Bible from a new portion of Scripture
- Memorize Bible verses
- Complete handbook activities

Optional Awards

Sparks can earn two <u>Church Attendance Emblems</u> per year for their vest if they attend church, 1 emblem for each 16 weeks of Awana. You can go to ANY church to earn this award. At Immanuel specifically, we count "attendance" as at least 50% attendance in Sunday School.

Sparks can also earn Extra Credit Awards if they finish their handbook and the specific Extra Credit Work. In fact, we'll give you an example schedule that will allow your Spark to complete their handbook and this year's extra credit.



Sparks books are broken up into sections called Jewels. There are Red and Green Jewel sections in their book.

When they finish a jewel unit, a plastic jewel is inserted into their uniforms.

When Sparks complete their Rank section they will earn a rank patch to be displayed on their uniform.

Wing and rank patch colors correspond with the books.

HangGlider: green WingRunner: blue SkyStormer: red

Sparks who complete their books earn book awards based on how many Sparks books they have completed.





3rd through 5th grade

The T&T (Truth & Training) curriculum teaches kids the truth of God's Word, and trains them to follow Him and practice His grace. In this curriculum series, kids will explore the fundamental doctrines of Christianity, including:

- The character and nature of God
- The structure and sequence of the Bible
- The redemption narrative
- Key practices for followers of Jesus


By encouraging kids to engage in highly biblical and relational discipleship, T&T helps students to grow and develop as lifelong followers of Jesus Christ.
