

## 2026 MFUGE MINISTRY TRACK DESCRIPTIONS

### TRACKS OFFERED AT ALL LOCATIONS:

#### **Children's Ministry**

This ministry track involves working with children in a variety of settings including: Vacation Bible Schools, Backyard Bible Clubs, day camps, and other site-specific work with children. Groups may work at churches, community centers, apartment complexes, children's homes, etc. The purpose of this track is to provide students with the opportunity to teach and lead children through Bible stories, games, crafts and music.

#### **Games and Recreation Ministry**

This ministry track is designed to help students use their athletic ability and willing hearts to share the gospel through sportsmanship and Christ-like attitudes. These tracks are located in children's centers or homes, apartment complexes, community centers and boys and girls clubs. Games and Recreation tracks will not always have the opportunity to lead Bible stories or share the Gospel directly, but will focus more on relational evangelism through intentional conversations. This track ministers to people of all ages, from pre-k to high school and even adults.

#### **Painting, Construction, and Yard Work Ministry**

Students in this track will spend their time doing yard work, repairing, cleaning, painting, and doing light construction work. These tracks work with various organizations such as Habitat for Humanity and local housing authorities to meet the physical needs of churches, schools, families and individuals. Students in this track will be encouraged to share the love of Christ with people they encounter through their work.

#### **Social Ministry**

This ministry track provides students a variety of ministry opportunities for meeting the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs of people. Students in this track may minister in: mentally/physically handicapped centers, nursing homes, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, food banks, clothing closets, furniture distribution centers, refugee ministries, prison ministries, Baptist Centers, Salvation Army sites, and other community organizations with similar purposes. Students will work both directly with people in the community as well as behind the scenes.

### LOCATION SPECIFIC TRACKS:

#### **Evangelism Ministry (*RIDGECREST*)**

This track is designed to give students an opportunity to share their faith with people in the community. The track will work in populated areas and will engage people in conversation through handing out refreshments, organizing activities, playing music, etc. Students may also partner with local churches to pass out flyers and prayer walk as part of church planting efforts.

**Beach Evangelism Ministry (*REGENT*)**

This ministry track is designed to provide students and adults with the opportunity to evangelize to people with whom you will be able to meet physical needs and build significant relationships with people on the beach. This could include a variety of ministry experiences. Most likely, you will encounter a variety of different culture groups and populations of people. Students will learn to plan and get to implement various kinds of relational ministry including organizing recreational activities, meeting physical needs and building relationships. This is a great opportunity for students to begin to serve outside their comfort zone.

**Park Ministry (*Philly*)**

In this ministry track, students and adults will serve in parks or other public gathering spaces within the city of Philadelphia. Activities may include setting up interactive stations such as sports, games, art activities, or simple crafts which invite conversation and connection. Students may also engage in one-on-one conversations, offer prayer, share the gospel, or serve the community through acts, such as trash collection or park improvement. This track emphasizes relational ministry by allowing students to learn how to initiate conversations, respond to people with love, and represent Christ well in everyday settings.

**Homeless Ministry (*Philly*)**

This track is designed to minister specifically to the homeless population. Students will spend each day visiting with the homeless in shelters, building relationships, serving meals, leading games with children, etc.

**Disabilities Ministry (*Mobile*)**

This ministry track is designed to meet the needs of children and adults with disabilities. Ministry opportunities will include Bible teaching, crafts, music, sports and recreation, field trips, and more. Ministry will take place at community centers, in children's homes, at nursing homes, etc.
