## BELLS AND WELCOME

## INVOCATION

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

**Congregation:** *(spoken)* Amen.

## CONFESSION OF SINS AND LIGHTING RITE

P: When God created the world, he made the crown of his creation--the human race--in his image (Genesis 1:26). Perfect people lived in a perfect world in a perfect relationship with God.

**C:** But mankind rebelled against God, bringing sin into the world and death to all. God declared the wages of sin to be death (Romans 6:23). **We, too, are guilty, and we confess our sinful thoughts, words, and actions.**

P: However, God--who is Love--did not want to be separated from his children forever. He promised a Savior who would bear the punishment for sin, defeat the devil, and break the bonds of death.

**O, come, O, come, Emmanuel,  
And ransom captive Israel  
That mourns in lonely exile here  
Until the Son of God appear.  
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel  
Shall come to you, O Israel!**

P: When the time had fully come, God sent his Son. Jesus, our Savior, has paid the ransom for your debt; your sins are forgiven (Galatians 4:4-5). In view of God's mercy, today we light the *joy* candle. Though we have not seen Jesus, we love him; and even though we do not see him now, we believe in him (I Peter 1:8).

**C:** **And we are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for we are receiving the end result of our faith, the salvation of our souls (I Peter 1:8,9).**

**O, come, our Joy, whose love forgives--  
Whose death assures that we will live!  
Move us to heed the call, "Repent!"  
And trust, for your sake, God relents.  
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel  
Shall come to you, O Israel!**

P: In this joy from God, we gladly hear and learn his message of salvation, proclaimed by the messengers, like John the Baptist, that God has sent. *Jesus is coming! Listen to his messengers.*

**C:** Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

**Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel  
Shall come to you, O Israel!**

**FIRST LESSON:**

**Isaiah 61: 1-3, 10-11**

The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me,  
because the LORD has anointed me  
to proclaim good news to the poor.

and release from darkness for the prisoners,

**SERMON LESSON:**

**John 1:6-8, 19-28**

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. <sup>7</sup> He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. <sup>8</sup> He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

<sup>19</sup> Now this was John’s testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. <sup>20</sup> He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, “I am not the Messiah.”

<sup>21</sup> They asked him, “Then who are you? Are you Elijah?”

He said, "I am not."

"Are you the Prophet?"

He answered, "No."

<sup>22</sup> Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

<sup>23</sup> John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'"

<sup>24</sup> Now the Pharisees who had been sent <sup>25</sup> questioned him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?"

<sup>26</sup> "I baptize with water," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know. <sup>27</sup> He is the one who comes after me, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie."

<sup>28</sup> This all happened at Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

## SPECIAL GIFTS

We thank the Lord for the regular gospel-motivated offerings that people give to support the work we do together as a group of believers. At this time of year, people often ask about giving a special gift to a specific area of ministry. ## IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

As people are planning their giving for 2021, there has generally been a tax advantage to be aware of if you are over 70 ½ and need to take a required distribution from an IRA. People (70.5 years or older) are able to designate distributions from their IRA (up to \$100,000 per year) for a non-profit, and that distribution is tax deductible for the individual. This could apply to special gifts or the regular offerings you give. Please note Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) were suspended for 2020 but will likely apply to 2021.
