## Epiphany is Uncertainty Reduction

There's a phenomenon we observe in our interpersonal communications called "uncertainty reduction." All of us have practiced this uncertainty reduction. We meet someone new. We know nothing about that person. We're guarded. We're unsure. So we start to trade information with that person. "So where are you from?" We share stories about ourselves. We listen to the stories the other tells. We discover we know the same people or we've been to the same places. We learn about each other. It drives away the unfamiliar. We share with each other to forge a bond and build trust and friendship. This is uncertainty reduction.

And it's what the season of Epiphany is all about. As we worship during these next weeks in the time in between Christmas and Lent, observe how the Gospel of the Day is a way that our Savior is saying: "Hi, I'm Jesus. Let me tell you a little about myself." On the festival of Epiphany, when Magi from the East come to visit, Jesus tells us, "I'm the Savior of the Nations." When Jesus goes out to the Jordan River to be baptized by John, Jesus tells us, "I came to take your place, to be your righteous substitute." When he heals Peter's mother-in-law and then droves of people came to visit him that evening, he is telling us, "I care about your hurts and your pains. So I came to reverse the effects of sin in this world." When he's transfigured on the mountain, we catch of glimpse of his divine identity which he so often hid behind human flesh."

Epiphany means revelation. In these next months we see Jesus practicing uncertainty reduction with us by revealing to us who he truly is and why he came to this earth. Because he doesn't want us to be strangers. He wants our relationship to be real and comfortable. He wants us to be as close as family. In fact, that's what we are.

Thank you, Jesus, for your epiphany to us. Now we are certain that you love us and have saved us. Amen.

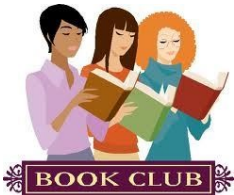
**Women in Christ Book Group** meets the second Tuesday of each month

## Mission Trip to London

One blessing of being part of a larger denomination is that we pool our resources together to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. Our synod is planting a church in London and we have the opportunity to be a part of a two month push this coming summer. St. Paul's can partner with our synod and this new mission start by sending over a team of 6-10 people for a 10-day period sometime between the dates of June 8<sup>th</sup> and July 29<sup>th</sup> depending on what our group chooses. We would arrive on a Saturday and leave the following Monday. Groups can decide to stay longer if they like. The church work is going to be focus in Central London, specifically Tower Hamlets.

The goals:

- 1) The WELS UK mission is looking at offering weekly church services in June and July. The mission needs more people to be in church as they invite guests.
- 2) Each group would spend 2-3 days volunteering in a UK run charity. The groups should engage others in conversation, let their light shine by word or deed, and invite them to a church service.
- 3) Encourage WELS UK members in their life of discipleship.

40-50% of the trip will be sight-seeing and the trips are self-funded. The estimated cost of travel and lodging will be about \$2500/person (this includes airfare and hotel stay). 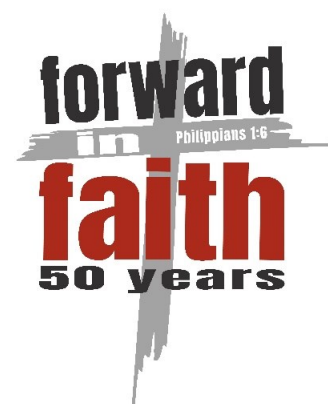
