Hope Fest is a citywide event that provides free groceries, clothing, medical, dental, haircuts, hygiene items and helping services to the most needy, underserved and marginalized populations. Hope Fest has operated in Tucson for over 25 years and in 2017 we served 10,000 hurting Tucsonans at the Tucson Convention Center. Since that weekend, we have been gifted the Center of

Opportunity location and will hold Hope Fest there from now on. Hope Fest provides over \$1 million dollars of good and services on that one day. 
