## Conversations with Jesus

### Lenten Worship Series

In this Lenten season, we will listen in on important conversations Jesus had with people. These conversations will invite us to cultivate a heart that seeks God first, to serve our neighbors, and to embrace the transformative power of God's Spirit.

These conversations with Jesus turn our attention to Lent as a time of spiritual preparation for Easter. It is not about accomplishing more, but about noticing God's work in our lives and opening ourselves to transformation. By turning attention inward and upward, we encounter the Gospel of God that sustains us and empowers us to act with compassion toward others. Lent becomes a journey of awakening to God's presence in ordinary and extraordinary moments.

Each of these conversations happen against a background of conflict and hostility. The settings for each conversation are charged with an emotional intensity, so that what we gain from these conversations is not merely something interesting, but life changing. Much is at stake, for the people in the story and for each of us.

These stories raise a basic question for us: what is the character of our conversations with Jesus? Is my relationship with God a kind of surface faith? Nothing more than an exchange of nice words? How much am I willing to dare and risk in sharing with God what matters, and even more so, to hear and receive from God what matters to God.

Ash Wednesday begins the conversation with the call to turn away from all that separates us from God, all that blocks our hearing, and to turn toward God with a humble spirit to speak, to listen, to be changed.

Each conversation touches upon things that are core to what it means to be a human being, how we deal with temptation, the mystery of God, the surprise of grace, how faith happens, deep grief. We end our Lenten journey noting that the closer we get to the cross, the less Jesus has to say, until finally the cross ends all conversation and the world waits in silence.






## Celebrate Ministry & Mission in 2025

### Celebration Worship, Soup Lunch & Annual Meeting February 8

Worship will begin at 10 a.m. with a blended service of organ and band-led music. A soup lunch will immediately follow at 11 a.m., and we plan to start the meeting by 12 noon.

At the annual meeting we will hear highlights from building committee about our Renewing progress, and the council will present a look at our financial standing as a congregation, and propose a budget for 2025 that the congregation will vote on. Let's remember and reflect on an amazing year of ministry, and prepare for the opportunities before us in 2026!



## A Souper Collection

On our Souper Sunday, February 8, the Housing & Hope Team are encouraging donations of hearty, pop-top soups such as the Campbell's Chunky line that are easy to prepare for our unhoused neighbors.

For people relying on the emergency overflow shelter for a warm place to sleep, they sometimes need to decide between getting to a meal site for dinner, and getting to the emergency overflow shelter by the time they are required to sign in for the night.

Easy - open and easy - to - warm cans of soup can help people in desperate situations to not have to choose between a warm bed and a warm meal. Hearty soups can be dropped off around weekend worship, or anytime the church is open during the week.

# Worship & Grow during Lent

The season of Lent, 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading up to Easter, is a season to dig deeper into our faith and what the salvation of the resurrection means to us. To help the season be more meaningful, we offer a number of extra ways to get connected to each other and our community.

## Ash Wednesday

On Ash Wednesday, Feb. 18 we will have worship at 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. The noon service will be traditional and the evening service will be blended with Ash Wednesday traditions and Echo Worship music. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent and the familiar passage from Genesis, "...dust you are, and to dust you shall return."

## Midday Lenten Worship

In addition to our weekly Wednesday evening Echo worship, we will be holding worship at 12 noon each Wednesday during Lent, February 18 – March 25. Each week AFTER Ash Wednesday a light lunch will be served to-stay or to-go after each midday worship service or Spring Serenade concert. Find more details on the concerts on page 9.

## Growing in Faith Together

At First Lutheran, the approach of Lent brings a time of reflection, growth, and fostering deeper connections within our congregation. One of the best connections we make is through our Confirmation Faith Mentors program — a wonderful opportunity for adults to engage meaningfully with our confirmation-aged youth.

Mentors are not expected to "know all the answers" or have an epic faith testimony to share. You just need to have an open heart to learn about and care about youth. Discussion topics are provided each week, so there's no guessing or need to make things up; just listen intently to each other and share from the heart.

Often our mentors come away feeling uplifted and say the experience helps them to better understand today's youth, and that the discussion helps them get more out of the worship services, and the experience deepens their faith as well. 
## February Monthly Luncheon

The First Lutheran Trust Committee is excited to announce the launch of a new initiative, The Legacy Project. This project will invite First Lutheran members to learn more about our Trust Fund and how they can create a lasting impact on the future of First Lutheran through estate gifts and planned giving.

In 1989 First Lutheran Church established a Trust Fund, a permanent endowment, that supports expenses beyond the scope of the annual operating budget and funds new initiatives. The Trust Fund has grown to more than \$1.3 million. Each year the Trust Fund distributes approximately \$50,000 from its income to support these special needs as requested by the Church Council.

First Lutheran is a vibrant and growing church community that is poised to increase its membership and expand its outreach. Our two recent capital campaigns have helped us renew our facility and be a welcoming place to all.

The Legacy Project is the next chapter in First Lutheran's future. Growing the Trust Fund will enable our staff and volunteers to fund new initiatives, build long-term sustainability, and create legacies that will ensure our church's mission continues to flourish for future generations.



## Spiritual Transformation: Making Space for God's Work in Our Lives

Spiritual transformation is about slowing down enough to notice where God is already present—within us, around us, and in the ordinary moments of life. It creates space to listen, reflect, and grow, not by fixing or rushing, but by paying attention with care and curiosity.

This February, you're invited to take part in two opportunities designed to support this kind of deep, gentle growth. Monthly Group Spiritual Direction offers a small, trusted circle where participants practice holy listening and reflect together on God's movement in their lives. Individual Spiritual Direction provides one-on-one space with a trained listener to explore questions, transitions, and invitations from God at your own pace. Whether you're longing for clarity, rest, or simply a place to be heard, these opportunities offer meaningful ways to engage in spiritual transformation this season.

### Individual Reflection or Spiritual Direction (Monthly)

Imagine sitting quietly with a spiritual director, who listens deeply and asks gentle questions to help you notice God's work in your life. This is ideal if you:

- Want one-on-one guidance
- Are navigating a life transition or season of questioning
- Long for a consistent rhythm of reflection and discernment

First Lutheran has many trained spiritual directors in the congregation. Email Michael or Sheila for more information or to set up a time.

### Group Reflection or Spiritual Direction (Monthly)

Picture a small circle of people, sharing openly while the group listens deeply. Everyone holds space for one another without fixing or advising, creating a safe environment for discovery. This works well if you:

- Enjoy learning from others' experiences
- Appreciate mutual encouragement and community
- Want to see God's movement in others' life stories

### What is Meal Packing?
