About the Artist:

Dr. Minji Kwon is a Korean-born pianist, educator, and recording artist known for her dynamic presence on both the concert stage and in academic settings. She holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from the University of Iowa, where she studied with Uriel Tsachor and Réne Lecuona and was awarded the prestigious Iowa Performance Fellowship. She also earned a Master's degree in Collaborative Piano from New York University under the guidance of Grant Wenaus and Deirdre O'Donohue. Her doctoral research highlights the solo piano works of Croatian composer Dora Pejačević.

A recipient of the Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship, Minji has performed internationally and currently serves as a staff collaborative pianist at the University of Iowa and répétiteur at the American Institute of Musical Studies (AIMS) in Graz, Austria. She has appeared with Orchestra Iowa—where she is guest principal pianist—as well as Cedar Rapids Opera, and co-founded Ensemble Yeon to champion contemporary Korean art song across the U.S. In 2025, she is featured at the Mid-North Horn Workshop alongside artists from the Boston Symphony Orchestra and University of Michigan, and performed at the international Economic Summit *Growing the Future Together* with soprano Kylie Gougler at the National Czech and Slovac Museum and Library.



In addition to her work as a pianist and educator, Minji has been studying organ with Dr. Brett Wolgast and has served in multiple church music roles, including as organist at St. Mark's United Methodist Church in Iowa City and Music Director at Iowa City Korean United Methodist Church.

She is currently the organist at First United Methodist Church in Iowa City and will serve as Church Music Coordinator at AIMS in Graz this summer, in affiliation with the Graz Cathedral.
