Parking Lot & Plaza Construction

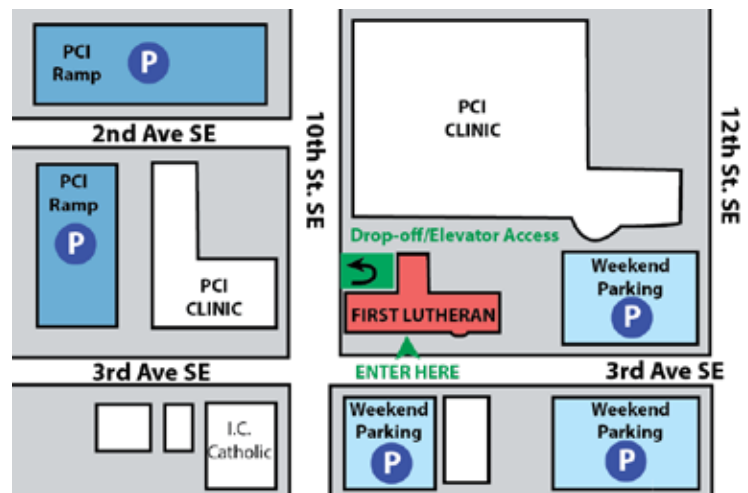
Our parking lot is now closed for re-grading, a new surface, and landscaping the entrance area plaza. We anticipate the entire lot being closed for about six weeks. **You Can** still participate in worship & events during this process. You can continue to park in all adjacent lots each weekend, and enter through the Third Avenue entrance. During the week, park in the PCI Parking Ramp (between 2nd and 3rd Ave.) and enter through the Third Avenue entrance.

Drop-off & Elevator Access

You can pull into the 10th St. driveway to drop people off to access the underpass entrance and elevator. NOTE: Because of the median on 10th St., you must come through the 3rd Ave/10th St. intersection to turn right into the drop-off area, which is usually the parking lot exit.

You Can Get Involved in Renewing our Facility!

There are many hands-on ways you can help with our ongoing renewing project — and your involvement will save thousands in contractor costs. Thanks to the incredible efforts of many members, Level 1 is already looking fantastic, but there's still much more to do all the way through the end of the year!

Here's how You Can Make a Difference:

1. Furniture Moving Team

As rooms are painted and flooring is updated, we need help moving furniture and storage items in and out. Due to the flexible nature of renovations, we often only know a day or two in advance when help is needed.

2. Painting Crew

Join the team to prep surfaces, mask edges, paint rooms, and clean up. It's rewarding work — there's nothing like seeing a freshly painted space come to life!

3. Door Restoration Project

Our biggest task is removing, refinishing, and reinstalling over 60 classroom and closet doors on the first and third levels. This project will be broken into manageable steps, with training and guidance provided.

Youth Take the Lead in Worship

Have you noticed a few young people step up recently on Sunday mornings to lead us in song, prayer, reading, greeting, ushering, setting up and/or serving communion since Easter? It's part of our *Growing Young* effort Initiative #2 "Work to involve more youth regularly in visible leadership roles at our 9 & 11 a.m. Sunday worship services with a goal to see at least one youth in a visible role every Sunday."

Lead Pastor for Outreach Pr. Craig Brown and our Ministry Engagement Coordinator Maddy Newhouse launched a pilot program with 22 participating young families this past spring to have at least one youth leading in some fashion each week at both the 9 & 11 a.m. worship services. Here's how it works: Maddy created an online sign up stretching from Easter to Reformation where families could select a date that works for their busy schedules. Then the available youth tells Maddy what role they would like to try. Maddy then partners them up with a willing adult already serving in that role to mentor them then when they are comfortable, have the youth take the lead.

Providing for Newborns in Liberia, West Africa

Pheobe Hospital is a familiar name to our long-time members. In the late 90s and early 2000's we had a ministry helping to supply this hospital and partners with everything from generators and tractors to IV stands and syringes, packing an entire sea container at a time.

Fast forward fifteen years, and we are once again connecting with Pheobe Hospital and others in Liberia. First Lutheran member Suah Borsay started working with Global Health Ministries gathering items and creating newborn baby kits. The kits outfit new mothers at Phoebe Hospital and others with a few supplies to get them started with their new baby. Suah has retold the story many times of these young mothers who come in and give birth with no supplies for their newborn, wrapping them just in bands of cloth.

With the help of family and friends - and most of the space in her living room - Suah began collecting, packing, and shipping hundreds of newborn kits through her own collections and word of mouth. As friends here at FLC learned of Suah's mission, many new options and opportunities to grow the ministry have arisen, including warehouse space to give the Borsay's their living room back!

Suah is currently collecting supplies for the next shipment! If you have gently used cloth diapers or baby clothes; or if you are a bargain hunting shopper, you can connect with Suah Borsay on Facebook, or email her at svborsay@yahoo.com. Watch for more to come for this rapidly growing ministry of caring for young mothers.

Each newborn kit includes:

- A large bath towel
- A couple of cloth diapers with covers and safety pins
- A onesie or a shirt and pants set
- A small bib
- A pair of socks
- A soft stocking cap
- A bar of soap to keep clean

All the items are packed into a large gallon-sized bag and labeled for either a boy or a girl.



Share the Joy with Altar Bouquets

Each week beautiful bouquets that decorate the altar are sponsored by the members of our church. People sponsoring bouquets have the option for taking them home or leaving them at the church, where Dee Anderson will make them into smaller arrangements which are distributed throughout the church for the week.

Earlier this year Cathy Jansa, who now lives out of state but still joins us online, (and still gets the newsletter; Hi Cathy!) sponsored our altar bouquets. She asked that the bouquets be delivered to one of our members who is home-based and doesn't get to worship in-person. Visitation Chaplain Sheila Anderson coordinated taking the flowers to Sue Olmstead the week of her 100th birthday! If you have considered sponsoring our altar flowers, but don't really need them, this option is a great way to spread some joy!

Renewing in Partnership with Wellington Heights Community Church

As part of our *Renewing for God's Mission* Campaign, we are reaching out beyond our own church to aid partners in ministry because we know that God's mission is greater than us. Our local renewing partner is Wellington Heights Community Church (WHCC), to whom we are granting \$50,000 to expand Christ's mission in the heart of the Wellington Heights neighborhood.

Lead Pastor Keeyon Carter says the church plans to use \$30,000 for their *Building Hope* building campaign dedicated to the maintenance and improvement of their two properties including replacing the siding on both buildings and ensuring they are properly waterproofed. They will also use \$20,000 toward renewing the Wellington Heights Neighborhood with community events and engagement such as Loads of Love Laundry, Christmas Store, and the Flourishing Neighborhood Index.

The Flourishing Neighborhood Index

In the Spring and Summer of 2024, this project measured the health of Wellington Heights across economic, social, and structural indicators, using neighbor-to-neighbor surveys to gather data. They are now sharing this information back with the residents, and carefully listening to residents' core areas of celebration and concern.

Pastor Carter shared with us that the data showed a great deal of pride when it comes to the Wellington Heights community, and that residents' desire to change their narrative because we know that while there is work to be done, beautiful things are happening in Wellington Heights that make it amazing and unique.

This project is a shared process, rich with mutualistic collaboration. All organizations, businesses, and individuals interested in the health and wholeness of Wellington Heights are encouraged to collaborate which is why we are eager to offer our humble support to this young church willing to lead bold initiatives to renew the community from within.
