


O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

P: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. (brief silence) Long-expected God,

All: we confess that we look to ourselves for the peace and security only you can provide. We reach for swords and spears, reluctant to release our grip on the ways of war. We become impatient while waiting and weary of keeping awake. Free us from self-reliance, and teach us to live in harmony with our neighbors. Increase our trust in God's timing, and awaken us to your advent among us, that we may abound in the hope you have promised. Amen.

P: God judges us not as we deserve, but according to God's own righteousness. You are freed and forgiven, saved by grace, and ready to welcome the Savior.

All: Amen.

Intro to the Reading:

L: Peace is more than the absence of conflict—it is the presence of God with us. Isaiah promises a child who will be called Immanuel, and Psalm 80 pleads for God's face to shine upon us. Paul reminds us that Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promises, bringing reconciliation and grace. In Matthew's Gospel, Joseph chooses peace by trusting God's plan. As we light the candle of peace and prepare for Christ's birth, we are called to be peacemakers—those who bring healing, hope, and unity to a divided world.

The Reading: Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19 NRSVue

L: ¹ Hear, O Shepherd of Israel, leading Joseph like a flock; shine forth, you that are enthroned upon the cherubim.

All: ² In the presence of Ephraim, Benjamin, and Manasseh, stir up your strength and come to help us.

L: ³Restore us, O God;

let your face shine upon us, and we shall be saved.

All: 4O Lord God of hosts,

how long will your anger fume when your people pray?

L: ⁵You have fed them with the bread of tears; you have given them bowls of tears to drink.

All: ⁶ You have made us the derision of our neighbors, and our enemies laugh us to scorn.

L: ⁷ Restore us, O God of hosts;

let your face shine upon us, and we shall be saved.

All: 17 Let your hand be upon the one at your right hand, the one you have made so strong for yourself.

L: ¹⁸ And so will we never turn away from you; give us life, that we may call upon your name.



The Gospel: Matthew 1:18-25 NRSVue

P: ¹⁸Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

²³ "Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." ²⁴ When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife ²⁵ but had no marital relations with her until she had given birth to a son, and he named him Jesus.

Lector—Go to Ambo before Prayer; remain up front for communion.


Offertory Prayer:

All: Amen.



Words of Institution




