Intro to the Reading:

L: Advent begins with a call to awaken and trust in God's promises, even when the future feels uncertain. Jesus calls us to be ready—not out of fear, but in faithful expectation. As we light the candle of faith, we ask: how can we live as people who trust God's promise, even in the unknown? Psalm 122 invites us into joyful worship, reminding us that faith is nurtured in community. Let us read responsively, Psalm 122.

The Reading: Psalm 122 NRSVue

L: ¹ I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord."

All: ² Now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem.

L: ³ Jerusalem is built as a city that is at unity with itself;

All: 4 to which the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord, the assembly of Israel, to praise the name of the Lord.

L: ⁵ For there are the thrones of judgment the thrones of the house of David.

All: ⁶Pray for the peace of Jerusalem:

All: 8 For the sake of my kindred and companions,


I pray for your prosperity.

P: [Jesus said to the disciples,] ³⁶ "About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. ³⁷ For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸ For as in the days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, ³⁹ and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so, too, will be the coming of the Son of Man. ⁴⁰ Then two will be in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. ⁴¹ Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken, and one will be left. ⁴² Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. ⁴³ But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴ Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."





Words of Institution




