There were many Jews in Jesus' day that maintained a level of "messianic HOPE." They were suffering at the hands of their Roman oppressors and held onto the belief that a Savior would appear on the scene to deliver them. Based on the Old Testament promises of a delivering king, they were anxious for the Messiah's coming. All God wanted was for the world to accept Him as the Messiah and Savior. Through Jesus' ancestry, virgin birth, fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies, teaching and miracles, God demonstrated who Jesus was.
