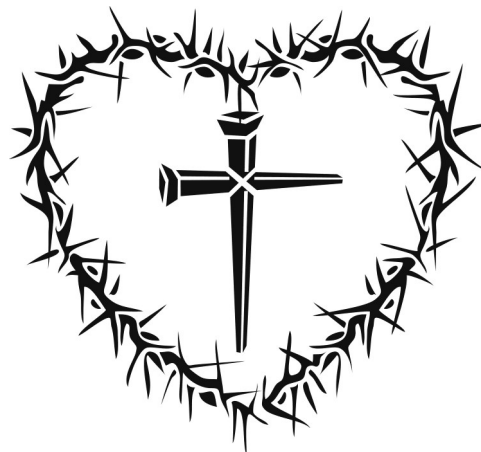

Sunday School's Origins

Sunday school began in England as early as 1751. Better known is Robert Raikes' work in Gloucester 30 years later. Concerned about poor children who worked in factories six days a week and often turned to crime, he offered classes on the only day kids were free. Soon various organizations offered a loose network of such Sunday schools, which taught basic reading and writing, using the Bible as a text.

Ten years later, Samuel Slater started the first U.S. Sunday school in his Rhode Island textile mills. By the mid-1800s, Sunday school attendance was an almost-universal childhood experience. As society became more secular and public education was mandated by the 1870s, Sunday schools focused on spiritual practices: prayers, hymns, catechism knowledge and Scripture memorization.

Well into the 20th century, Sunday school served as the church's main outreach tool. Many adults fondly remember their teachers and lessons, and Sunday school continues to play a significant part in faith development.

On Sunday, July 19th, please worship with us at 10:00 am in the Fellowship Hall that morning instead of at the church since we will be at camp.

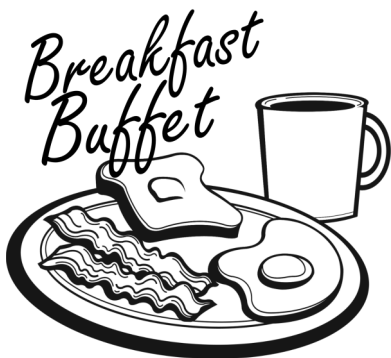

Reflections

by Arlene Rebman

(In an earlier Reflection, Jake Myer wrote his recollections of our 1977 Disaster Relief Trip to Johnstown. I asked Arlene Rebman and Pauline Seiler for their recollections of the same trip. After some discussion, Arlene wrote the following memories.)

Many of our disaster trips are to the south, but on this one we went to Johnstown, PA. It was not about re-building, but cleaning the mud that was left behind after a flood.

We left on a school bus driven by Bill Myer of the Mt. Zion Road Church. The people on the bus were from Little Swatara, Mt. Zion Road and Annville Churches of the Brethren.

We arrived at the church where we were spending the night. They had two large rooms with beds for the men and the women. We could relax and visit, having a good time. Arlene Hershey kept us laughing and having a good time by telling jokes and stories.

In the morning, the ladies of the church served us breakfast, before we left on the bus for our assignments. The women went to a home for the elderly and washed walls. One-time washing the walls did not clean them. We had to wash them three or four times. We worked there all day, except for our lunch break across the street. The men worked at digging the mud out of a basement of a house.

At the end of the day we went back to the church to wash and eat supper. The men were lucky. They could go across the street to take showers. There was a coal mine entrance and there were showers they could use. After supper we were off to bed.

Day 2- After breakfast the bus came and took the men to shovel more mud and took us to help clean up greenhouses. The water and mud went over all the greenhouses and destroyed all the plants. We spent the day removing mud. Someone brought lunch for us. When we were ready at the end of the day, the owner and his wife came. They couldn't thank us because they were crying. They could now plant their Christmas flowers. I think some of us also cried and were thankful that we could help and make a blessing for others even though we were dirty and tired.

Members of Little Swatara who went on the Disaster Relief Trip were: Lee & Arlene Rebman, Gerald and Pauline Seiler, Jake & Dixie Myer, Kenneth & Kathryn Wenger and Richard Frantz. If you know of anyone else, please let Richard know. We don't want to omit anyone. We took tools and equipment along- such as wheel barrows, shovels, rakes, a trash pump and hoses.

We are scheduled to be in session on Monday, February 16th, President's Day. If your child will not be in attendance please notify their teacher. Thank you!

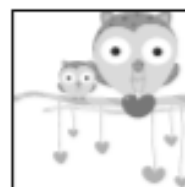
