PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Jesus didn't have a big screen. Or a praise team. Or study guides. Or even an app. He never posted on Facebook, put a hashtag "#Jesuslovesyou" on Instagram, or tweeted; "This whole Son of God, Son of Man gig is getting old fast." He never sent an email, or a text. He never used a cell phone, an Ipod, a laptop, desktop, or a touchscreen Ipad.

Jesus didn't worry His sermon length or parking capacity or what kind of coffee is served in the lobby. There were no brands or websites. Honestly, as we look to our future at Little Swatara, what has air conditioning got to do with our mission to share Jesus? There's no A/C in the Bible. Wouldn't God be better served if the money we used to cool our buildings were instead given to the poor?

Travel with me to a church we'll call St. Joseph's church in Phoenix, AZ. That congregation could save about \$4000 a year by skipping the A/C. Simply turn it off. No one would ever notice IN JANUARY. Then come summer, the temperatures rise, and in their case, the attendance falls.

I know this topic has many unsettled questions. Why do we even need it for 3 months out of the year. Some of you may stop reading now. Please know my heart, my intent is not to step on any ones toes. My heart is for the people of this congregation but even more as Jesus commands, my heart is for my neighbor. I want us to do everything we can to love our neighbors well. And we know Jesus includes everyone as our neighbor. Love is at the core of who we are.

This brings me to the real matter of the heart. When it comes to serving Jesus, practical things matter. Not anywhere near as much as spiritual things, but nonetheless they matter. Go back to St. Joe's with me. It August, and it's 111 degrees outside, and almost that hot inside. There's a few folks complaining, attendance has dropped, but nothing has changed from a spiritual perspective. The Word is still being preached. The praise band still plays (except for Louie the drummer who was taken to the hospital for heat exhaustion.) When attendance goes down, we know giving goes down. But the drop has nothing to do with Jesus. But please hear this. Our faith has always been a mixture of the spiritual and the practical. We see this in Christ—both man and God. He was God's son—but he also had human needs. He got sleepy. Hungry. He stubbed His toe. He used the restroom.

Air conditioning, chairs, buildings, and electricity are only practical tools that allow the body of Christ to gather in comfort. Big screens, videos, Facebook, emails, cell phones, allow us to reach and teach more effectively. Just because these things aren't mentioned in scripture doesn't mean we're doing it all wrong. We don't wrestle against the material world—we use it for the best of our advantage to reach the lost without compromising the Gospel message. No doubt, the spiritual will always trump the practical. So here's my heart on the matter. When we fail to get the practical things right, spiritual things suffer. So I challenge our hearts to move toward a few practical ways to reach the lost. Regardless what we do, we honor Christ. We rely on Him for the spiritual direction. I love you all so very much.



FROM THE Newsletter EDITOR...




He ascended to Heaven and a place for the faithful prepares That whosoever believeth in Him should not perish But the promise of eternal life will be theirs.







Noah took many animals into the ark. Connect the dots to find out which animals these are. Color them and draw their mates.





IS YOUR LIGHT GROWING DIM?

Albert Schweitzer, the gifted physician, scientist, musician, and missionary, said that at times our own light seems to go out. Sometimes we feel rather dim or washed out. Know the experience?

Schweitzer suggested that our light can be rekindled by another person whose light is still strong and whose presence can increase the power of our own light.

Our light can be increased as we live in relationship with the "light of the world."

In John 8:12, Jesus says: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness" (NRSV). In Jesus' light, we find that the light in our own life is increased.

St. Paul told how Christ's light should affect us: "In the Lord you are light. Live as children of light..." (Ephesians 5:8, NRSV).
