It has been more than 15 years since Henry Blackaby wrote his enormously popular book, "Experiencing God" The subtitle is "Knowing and Doing the Will of God" If you haven't read the book, you probably know someone who has. If you haven't read it, borrow a copy and give it a read. The book has a simple, yet challenging message: Find out where God is at work and join Him there. Simple, yet so very important.

Fifteen years after its release, it has sold more than 4 million copies and has been licensed in 62 languages, from Chinese and Mongolian to Hebrew and Arabic.

Blackaby was pastor at Faith Baptist Church in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, for 12 years and then served as director of missions in Vancouver for two years before moving to the United States to become director of prayer and spiritual awakening at the North American Mission Board. "Experiencing God is my life's message," he says. "It's how I have always understood and walked

Here are the "Seven Realities of Experiencing God" described within the book

- 1. God is always at work around you
- 2. God continually pursues a love relationship with you
- 3. God invites you to join Him in His work
- 4. God speaks to you
- 5. God's invitation will lead to a crisis of belief that requires faith in action
- 6. You must adjust your life in order to join God in what He is doing.
- 7. You come to know and experience God by doing His will and accomplishing His work

Since the beginning of time, God has wanted to have an intimate relationship with his children. Intimacy with God is the heart and soul of all that we are and all that we do as followers of Christ.





MAY MISSION OF THE MONTH

BRETHREN HOUSING ASSOCIATION is a Christian ministry in the city of Harrisburg providing housing and supportive services to homeless and low-income families. Their goal is to help these families transition from homelessness to self-sufficiency through loving, faith-based, housing and mentoring in order to help them achieve their God-given potential. Brethren Housing Association (BHA) was originally founded in 1989 by two Church of the Brethren congregations that wanted to answer God's call to help the poor, particularly the homeless. Today it has grown to include 11 partner congregations. Brethren Housing Association operates three programs:

Transitions: A transitional housing program for homeless women and children

Fast Track: A four month rapid re-housing program for homeless families

Next Steps: A permanent housing program providing case management support, and in some case rental assistance, to formerly homeless families living in the community, many graduates of the Transitions or Fast Track programs.

Do good stewards live longer?

I have a theory about good stewards. It's probably just a supposition. My supposition is this: That Christians who are faithful managers of their accumulated possessions live longer.

Now, of course, I can't document this. I have no hard data. I have no figures to prove this. But for many years I have made some interesting observations.

A strange tranquility seems to settle over people after they get their financial houses in order. And the converse also seems to be true. An untidy financial house can be a source of anxiety.

People seem to relax—and maybe live a little longer—when they get their wills up to date, when they make provisions for their families, when they let go for God's work.

If I were a doctor perhaps I could relate these financial matters to psychosomatic illnesses. Maybe feelings of guilt from not having a will affects one's health. Maybe it's turmoil over legal complexities, worry about taxes, fear of inadequate retirement income.

But I don't have to be a doctor to notice the joy, the satisfaction, and the fulfillment—even the excitement—when people quit procrastinating. When they complete their estate planning. When they start getting secure income from a gift annuity. When they are relieved of management burdens by way of a charitable remainder trust. When they minimize their tax liabilities. When they participate in the mission of the church.

I don't want to be misunderstood. I am not talking about life after death. Sure, there is eternal life for Christians. Sure, possessions can be used to extend our usefulness long after our work on earth is done.

No, I am suggesting that as good stewards we may live longer, right here and now, if we get our affairs in order. If we plan carefully for the needs of our families and for the work of the church.

Then we can relax and enjoy the fulfillment. And live!


Recognition Night




A Fish Story





The fish and loaves occur consistently in the very frequent early Christian portrayals of a meal. Unquestionably the early Christians celebrated a meal together that was based on the multiplication of the loaves. The nature of that meal has been much debated. Because the same elements, fish and loaves, continues into even the post-Constantinian iconography of the Last Supper, many have supposed the meal found so frequently in early Christian art was indeed the Eucharist, or even an attenuated version of the New Testament Lord's Supper.
