

District Conference 2023 Briefing by Pam Gerberich

The ANE (Atlantic Northeast District) is the district that represents Little Swatara Church of the Brethren to the wider conference of churches. Alane Riegel, Mike Peace, and Pam Gerberich were the representatives to district conference this year. Prior to conference there was a Delegate briefing, Bible Study on 1 Peter 3. 8 -9, and a worship service. At the worship service on Friday evening Shawn O'Brien from West Green Tree Church of the Brethren challenged each of us to look beyond "the differences" and focus on similarities, find the common ground. He challenged us to think beyond our own individual preferences and to yield to what is best for the community of faith following Jesus Christ. Also on Friday evening pastors with 10, 25, and 50 years of ordination were recognized for their faithful service. Pastor Matt was recognized for being ordained for 10 years. Also some may remember John Miller, he has been ordained for 10 years and serves at Mohrsville.

The theme for this year was "The Tie That Binds". Delegates heard reports from the commissions in the district and then as we sat around the tables we answered questions related to each of these ministries. The Commissions are Church Development, Ministry, Nurture, Witness and Outreach, and Stewardship.

In business items there was the acceptance of 3 congregations leaving the district -- Lewiston COB, Akron COB, and New Beginnings COB. Their disorganization was accepted but some opposed this on a note of sadness.

The budget for 2024 was approved. Each congregation is asked to pay \$55.00 per member to the district to support the ministries of the district. There was a call to challenge ever member to give an additional \$1 per week above what the congregation has committed to the ANE district. The congregations are also called to support Seeds of Faith at \$5 per average worship attendance and Camp Swatara at \$7.50 per member donations. Bethany Theological Seminary, Brethren Homes, COBYS Family Services and Mission & Ministry Board are also areas that congregations are encouraged to support. Would you consider the challenge of additional monies to support the ministries of the ANE District?

Are you aware of the ministries that the district is involved in? Older Adult Fellowship & Activities, Youth ministries, Stewardship University, Women's Spring Fellowship, Urban Ministries Initiative, Women's Camp, Hispanic Leadership Team, Church 2 Church, Pastoral Placement, Disaster Response, Church planting & Rebirth, Seeds of Faith Fund, Barnabas Fund, Helping Hands Benevolence Fund Grants, Facilities Assistance and Grants. In the afternoon there was a time of questions and answers with Pete Kontra ,district executive and Jim Grossnickle-Batterton, District Board Chair. There was an insight session presented by Ryan Braught on looking at our changing world and involving us in discussion at our tables of how things are changing. Reports were shared from Elizabethtown College, Camp Swatara, Eder Financial , Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center, Historical Committee. There was time to celebrate the retirements of Kay Weaver from the District offices and Mark Cunningham from

Reflections

As promised last month, I plan to discuss our church library in this month's Reflections. So take out your October church newsletter and check your answers to the quiz I provided.

In the True-False section, number one is *false*. Numbers two through eight are *true*. (How are you doing so far?)

In the Completion section:

Judy Emerich is our church librarian.

The library is located next to the **Oak Classroom**.

The big red books are our monthly newsletters. We have them bound every three years. Incidentally, we bind our Sunday morning bulletins every year. Those can be found in the book cases with glass doors. You are welcome to use them to check specific things that happened over the years.

A fiction book is based on a writer's ideas, imagination and opinion.

A non-fiction book is based on facts.

Before our congregation built our spacious new facility in 1963-64, our forebears provided a library for us to read. At Schubert Meeting House the library was up front right next to the stairway leading to the basement. That book case is now in our present library. It is one of the three with glass doors. I remember that seventy years ago, I read every *Hardy Boys* book available in the Schubert library. Since I seldom worshipped in the other three meeting houses, I cannot remember where those libraries were.

Today our library provides many more possibilities. We continue to provide pleasurable fiction selections. Upstairs in the foyer, there is a mobile cart with various titles, both fiction and non-fiction. You do not need our librarian, Judy Emerich, there to check them out. It is based on the honor system. Take it when you wish and return it when you are finished with it.

Although many Little Swatara members and attenders subscribe to our denomination's *Messenger*, we have been keeping a copy of those magazines since 1962 for those who want to read articles and check the pages listing memberships, wedding anniversaries, deaths, and minister placements. Those are placed on a top shelf, so ask Judy to assist you in getting them.

Ladies, do you enjoy reading novels by writers such as Beverly Lewis and Karen Kingsberry? The library has them for you.

Parents, are you aware of the many dozens of selections for your children? The library has them for you.

Some folks like reading materials by Joyce Meyer. Check out the availability. One would expect a church library to have materials in church history, theology, etc. It is true, our library has myriad possibilities in those areas.

If video tapes and DVDs are your thing, check the library's offerings.

If there is a resource you would like that our library does not have, request that the library purchase a copy. If possible, the church will purchase a copy for the permanent collection.

Remember, the library is here for you to use.

How well do you know....

What goes into keeping the cemetery at Little Swatara in top notch condition.



If you're like this writer, you have never thought much about or knew much about the responsibilities and care that is required to maintain and service the cemetery.

Just to understand the procedure to prepare for a funeral the following must happen in an orderly manner:

~When the death call is received from the funeral home, or the family, a date, time of funeral, location of funeral and approximate arrival time at cemetery is noted. You may need to talk with the family to find out if there is a stone in place (It is easier if a pre-need marker is in place.) or if they own multiple plots. Have the funeral home contact Esterly Burial Vaults Company to reserve date, time and get a price.

~Go to cemetery and mark the burial plot.

~Call Esterly to let them know the grave site is marked off so they can open the grave. Give Esterly the name of the cemetery, section, plot, and approximate location in the cemetery. Give date and time of funeral, service location with approximate arrival time.

~After the funeral, stop at cemetery to put marker pins away and pick up burial permit if funeral was held at the church.

~After the burial, you need to send Disposition/Transit permit to the local registrar within 10 days or if a cremation, you need a copy Record for Internment of Cremated Remains.

~Record the burial and keep a copy of the burial permit on record.

Who has performed the above as a volunteer for the past twenty-one and a half years?

Little Swatara has **Dennis Emerich** to thank. Following Lester Bashore's resignation April 17, 2001, Dennis took over soon after with training from Lester. In that time span, there were

eighty-eight funerals and twenty-one cremations. Each grave site had to be leveled and grass planted. There were thirty-eight cemetery lots sold with Jean Eberly and Judy Emerich typing the deeds. The deeds go to the moderator and church clerk to be signed and notarized before being taken to the family and payment is collected. Fifty-four foundations for flat markers were dug and concreted. (Record keeping for this started in 2004.) 4 concrete collars were installed around flat markers.

The large bushes in the center circle were kept trimmed until Sharon Dosch priced and coordinated the new landscaping in 2021. With the help of Sharon and Gary Emerich, a small memorial garden was constructed at the entrance of the cemetery using a bench donated by Ruth Keeney in memory of Paul Zigler.

Under Dennis' service, rules and regulations have been updated; sales of cemetery lots and burials have been recorded; maps are updated, and copies are kept in the church office; a list of responsibilities for the chairperson has been made.




