The next meeting is held September 1 – Note change of date due to Labor Day.




## **EXERCISE CLASS BEGINS SEPTEMBER 21**

## Fall Birding Trip to Cape May, NJ - September 18-20



# Little Swatara Preschool

September 2015



Dear Friends,

Welcome to the Little Swatara Preschool family. We're excited about beginning our twenty-first year of fun filled classes at Little Swatara. And we're *delighted* to have your child as a member of our program. We are looking forward to the many activities that will encourage and help your child to ready themselves for life. We are forming friendships that could last a lifetime.

I would like to review parent notification and program tuition costs with you. At the beginning of each month your student will bring home a Preschool newsletter accompanied by a classroom calendar. This information will briefly tell of activities the classroom teachers have planned for your child to participate in while at Little Swatara Preschool. Please feel free to talk with either your child's teacher or myself, Miss Cindy, any time during the school year. We are willing to schedule conferences at your convenience. We conduct telephone and onsite conferences. We care about your child, their social, spiritual and academic growth.

When paying tuition you are paying for a years worth of classes your child is scheduled to attend. The Preschool classes have 70 sessions, while Pre Kindergarten classes have 105 sessions. The tuition amount is divided by nine to equal the monthly tuition. Preschool classes monthly tuition is \$75 and Pre Kindergarten classes are \$100. The Pre Kindergarten 1 class has additional cost to cover the extended days scheduled in March, April (\$145) and May(\$116). Tuitions payments are accepted monthly unless other arrangements have been made with me. **Please use the tuition payment book provided and include the appropriate stub with your payment.** Please know the staff at Little Swatara Preschool is interested in your ideas and concerns that could help improve our program. If you have an idea to share, please don't

hesitate to speak to a staff member. We want the learning process to be enjoyable and fun for your child and their classmates We look forward to hearing from you. I can be reached at the Church (717)933-4723 or at my home (717)274-9875. Let's have a great year growing and learning about God, others and ourselves.

Biblical Studies During Circle Time we will be presenting stories of God's creation of the world from curriculum by Gospel Light Publishing Co. entitled "Bright Beginnings, Exploring God's World". The Bible concepts will be presented through Bible stories and verses, music and action rhymes, interactive prayer and conversation with the children. A variety of presentation styles are used to help each child understand the concept being taught. Our goal is to help your child build a foundation of spiritual understanding. We want to apply Bible concepts in a way that relate to a child's everyday life. "Adapted from 2003 Gospel Light Exploring God's World Curriculum Guide. The lessons will be presented to the children using beautifully colored flannel board pieces and the Pre K children will be involved low budget plays, acting out the Bible stories on a weekly basis.

#### **Kindergarten Readiness Skills**

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

Name writing and recognition will be the first kindergarten readiness skills emphasized in our classrooms this fall. All students are asked to be recognizing their printed name and to start writing or tracing their first name. The children will be asked to use the Zaner-Bloser style of writing. An example of the Zaner-Bloser alphabet will be sent home the first week of class. All students are asked to write their name with pencil using upper and lower case letters. Example: Miss Cindy is acceptable, not, MISS CINDY. Pre-K students will start writing referring to a house diagram, "Where do your letters live?" This is a technique to help the children learn correct letter placement and form. Please encourage your child to do their best.

by all students. The Preschoolers are invited to wear an item of clothing representing the color of the week. The item could be a shirt, socks, belt or ponytail band. This is a fun way to reinforce the color of the week. The Pre K students will be blending primary colors to create secondary colors.

Alphabet letters will be introduced in a variety of ways. The Preschoolers will have the alphabet letters presented in alphabetical order. The Pre K students will have letters presented in an order that promote small word formation.

#### Field Trips

The Pre K classes will be taking a trips to Over Home Alpaca Farm on October 12. There is no cost involved. Please watch for a permission slip with more detailed information to follow in October.

The Preschool classes will visit Wheel Crest Farm this fall. The Mon/Wed class will visit on Wed, September 30. The Tues/Thurs class will visit Thurs, October 1. There is no cost involved.

Transportation for field trips occur by car pooling to the sites. One adult may accompany each student. Siblings are not invited to attend the field trips. More information to follow.

#### Class Pictures

Are scheduled to be taken the beginning of October. Outback Photography of Lebanon will be taking individual and class photos. Information on cost and dates will be sent home later this month.

#### **Show and Tell**

All classes will have Show and Tell each week. The item your child brings to show and tell about is to begin with the Letter of the Week. If the letter is D, d the item to show might be a dog, dollar, daisy, a toy duck, or a picture of Uncle Dave. Be creative, but if it is not an obvious item, please tell one of the teachers or write a note about how the item represents the Letter of the Week. **Preschool classes** will have Show and Tell on Wednesdays and Thursdays **beginning September 16 and 17**. The **Pre K classes** will have Show and Tell on Thursdays **starting September 3**.


