

### THE IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER



Amid the beautiful rolling terrain just outside Bardstown, Kentucky, sits the Abbey of Gethsemani in which resides a community of Trappist monks. All who enter the Trappist Monastic Order take vows of poverty, work, and silence in order to discipline themselves for a life of prayer.

On my first visit to Gethsemani, I took with me a suspicion that these hooded figures were running from the world. After a day in this community of prayer, I quickly changed my mind.

Selected monks are allowed to break their vow of silence in order to speak with visitors to the monastery. Conversing with our host for the day, the question was asked, "How do you justify living so completely apart from the world?" No defensiveness marked the monk's answer, only firm resolve. After acknowledging that God calls people to many different tasks, the man said, "Our ministry is prayer. We pray for the world. We pray for the success of the gospel in the world. We pray for people in all areas of life. Our ministry of prayer is as important as other functions in life, more important than most." Never before had I heard such a moving statement about the importance of prayer.

I thought of the regularity with which Jesus went alone to pray and of the eagerness of the disciples to learn how to pray. The gift of prayer is an extension of God's action in creation and redemption; an indication of God's desire for fellowship with that part of creation shaped in the divine image.

When we pray, we make a contribution to God. Persons serious about prayer praise God's name, extol God's wisdom, express delight in God's presence, marvel at God's might, and bow in awe before God's love and grace. Even when requests dominate our prayers, we affirm God by our effort to commune with God. Offering prayers to God allows us to give to God a part of what God seeks from us. What could be more important than an action that brings pleasure to God?

Prayer is one important way we identify ourselves as human. When we honestly open our lives to God in prayer we realistically face who we are – neither self-made nor self-sufficient persons, but creatures who will never outgrow a need for our Creator. We are sinners in search of a forgiveness that is beyond our ability to earn or achieve. We are social beings longing for the kind of love and relationship that is available only from a God-sent Savior.

Jesus prayed regularly. The earliest disciples of Jesus recognized the importance of prayer and requested, as well as received, help for their praying. **Nothing is more important than prayer**.





#### MORTGAGE UPDATE


We started with a \$500,000 balance on September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2012. At the end of December 2013 we had a balance of \$325,558.80. Six months later, as of June 30<sup>th</sup> 2014 the mortgage balance is \$298,635.74. We paid off \$26,923.06 in the first six months of 2014 for an average of \$4487.17 on the principal and an average of \$1110.90 monthly interest for a total monthly average paid of \$5598.07. We finally reached the point where we are putting more than \$2050 toward the principal with each payment we make of \$3096.65.

We have a goal of having the mortgage paid off within 5 years to avoid renewing the mortgage and be subject to a possible interest rate increase. Currently we are paying an interest rate of 4.25%. From July 1, 2014, to reach the goal of having the mortgage paid by September 22<sup>nd</sup>,2017, we need to pay average monthly payments \$8211.86. The current envelope Building Fund giving is averaging \$4500 per month. That means that we only need \$3711 extra per month.

It appears that the pledges are being honored. Early on it was decided not to keep track of these pledges and that it would be strictly up to each individual whether they could keep honoring their pledge. We know that family conditions change. Fortunately, sometimes they also change for the better and as a result we have received some nice lump sum payments. We received some payments that came from turning some appreciated stock over to the church instead of selling it and paying taxes on the gain. This way they could make a larger payment to the building fund and avoid the capital gains taxes. Do you fit in a position like that?


The spiritual Nurture committee has \$20,000 in a Good Samaritan fund that they do not need at this time and is not gaining any interest returns. They decided to loan this to the building fund interest free. If this stays available until the end of the 5 years it would mean an interest savings of over \$2550. Is this a possibility for other individuals or groups?


Thanks to everyone, including the Women's Fellowship for their support. With a little extra along the way we can make our goal of 5 years and celebrate a job well done.

## Little Swatara Preschool

Dear Friends,

Welcome to Little Swatara Preschool. We are glad your child is a member of our preschool family. We're excited about beginning our twentieth year. Wow, 20 years! Our teachers are planning many fun activities. The staff will be loving and encouraging in a safe environment. They will be building each student's physical, mental, emotional, social and spiritual skills. These skills will help carry the children throughout life. We seek God's guidance and blessing upon each class session. We will be forming friendships that could last a lifetime.

Our teachers will use a variety of learning techniques that will make learning active, creative and fun for the children. At Circle Time, we will be using the "Beginners Bible Building Block" curriculum by David C. Cook Publishing Co. This curriculum was designed to help strengthen our students foundation of Christian values. A Parents Page that will be sent home with your child most weeks. This page tells you about the Bible story or thought discussed during Circle Time. It gives you the opportunity to ask your child what they remember about the story from our class that week. Rereading the story together will show your genuine interest in what your child is learning at Preschool.

The Kindergarten Readiness work completed this month is name recognition and writing, cutting and gluing. All children will be asked to begin recognizing their printed name and to start writing or tracing their name. Colors and the alphabet will be introduced. All of this information will be presented in a structured small group environment that flows smoothly by following classroom rules. These rules encourage group as well as individual growth. The teachers expectation of the children's abilities will be age appropriate.

At the beginning of each month our Preschool newsletter and class calendars can be viewed on line at *littleswatara.org*. (If you do not have access to a computer, upon request a hard copy of both the newsletter and calendar will be provided to you). The newsletter tells of class activities and includes other important Preschool information and announcements.

#### SHOW AND TELL

Please know we use **a lot** of paper that has already been printed on one side for worksheets, practice papers, etc. We will also be using magazine subscription cards to practice cutting. The cards can be cut into several pieces by the children. The cards are perfect for this activity because they are thicker than regular paper and are easy for little hands to hold. So, instead of throwing away those subscription cards, gather them and have your preschooler bring them to class. **Thank you.**

#### **LEARNING BEGINS AT HOME**






