### Season of Giving

Our family recently watched a 1998 Disney program called "Mickey's Once Upon a Christmas." It features Mickey and Minnie, who were down on their luck. It showed them having bills to pay and working in jobs where they were taken advantage of and not appreciated. Mickey and Minnie both worked hard to buy something special for each other, but it seemed they would not have enough to buy the gift they wanted to give. For Mickey, he wished to give Minnie a gold chain to compliment her family locket, and Minnie wanted to give Mickey a beautiful case for his prized harmonica. Christmas came, and they exchanged gifts only to discover that they had both traded in their prized possession to afford a gift for the other. They laughed and embraced as they now had a case with no harmonica and a necklace with no locket to hang on it. This brief program was surprising in how gritty the story could be and how strong of a sacrifice these characters made, exchanging their most prized possessions to give to each other. The story is credited to being adapted from O. Henry's 1905 "The Gift of the Magi," which similarly ends with another cosmic irony between a husband who sells his watch for special combs for his wife who sold her hair to a wig maker to buy him a chain for his watch. In each story, it is clear how far they are willing to go for each other. The original story got its name from its conclusion, which states that those who are able and willing to sacrifice their material possessions for the people they love are as wise as the magic.

As the year winds down and the air fills with a festive chill, both secular and spiritual symbols point us to one of the most cherished aspects of this holiday season: giving. For Christians, this season serves as a poignant reminder that giving reflects the very character of God. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16. Whether through grand gestures like selling your prized harmonica or locket or simple acts of care to those around you, giving brings light into the lives of others—and our own.

Last month, we celebrated Stewardship Sunday. We appreciate your continued support of the ministries of this church. Next April, we celebrate our church's 170th anniversary (1855-2025). This enduring presence and outreach in the community for so many years is one of the greatest testaments to how God's sustaining power. As we celebrate this season, let us embrace the spirit of generosity and carry it into the new year. Most importantly, let us remember the main reason for this season: Jesus— the greatest gift we have ever received.

# Our 2025 Stewardship Campaign "WHEN WE GIVE, WE FLOURISH!"

Psalm 92:12-13

If you have not yet returned your 2025 Pledge / Estimate Card, please do so as soon as possible. The faithfulness of each one of us is the foundation of our church's mission and ministry in the coming year!





The Mission Team would like to thank each member of the congregation who donated money, items for layettes and wash kits, and other items such as insect repellent wipes. We also appreciated those who prayed for us while we were in Nicaragua. It was a very rewarding experience, but also strenuous and challenging mainly due to hiking steep, muddy trails and living in a house with dirt floors and a leaky roof.

We assembled and installed water filters in 38 homes with children, pregnant women, or family members with disabilities so they could have safe drinking water. We reached 71 children through the Vacation Bible School and hand hygiene program. Eighteen women attended the nutrition workshops and cooking demonstrations: many more attended just the educational sessions. Each community member greeted us warmly and welcomed us into their homes.

Many thanks to the team members who gave their own resources for plane tickets, supplies, and program materials. The team took ten days from their usual schedule to serve with AMOS Hope and Health in Nicaragua. The work they did will help the community members for years to come and local water promoters will follow up with the families to be sure the water filters are being used and cleaned properly and provide new

parts as they wear out. Each filter should last about 5 years before replacement parts are needed.

Thanks to Pastor Steve, Kerry Triplett, Kathie Manda, Laurie Tourtellot, Diana Parker, Joyce Parker, Lia Norman, Sarah Doyle and Margo Humenczuk for serving our brothers and sisters in Nicaragua with a joyful heart.




#### **NOVEMBER OFFERING**

In November, we will receive the Deacon Fellowship Fund Communion Offering which allows our church to help members and friends of our church going through a crisis or transition. **We gave: \$100.00** 

#### **December Communion**

Our December Communion Offering will be taken for the Bethel Neighborhood Center for their programming with children, youth, and senior adults.





Our Church giving dropped in October to \$9,443, while our budget called for \$13,168. But for the year to date, we have given \$132,803 while the budget called for \$131,664. We have had to make withdrawals recently from our Unrestricted Endowment (\$16,221) to maintain cash flow, but we anticipate this will be reduced in the new year as Punkin Patch finances improve. For October, expenses exceeded income by \$5,470.



PUNKIN PATCH REDUCED THEIR monthly debt by adding a significant number of new students in October and November, and even more in January. In January, we will have 115 children enrolled in Punkin Patch!

## Spotlight on David Page

My wife and I have been members of the beloved community at First Baptist Church of KCMO since the Summer of 2021. The pandemic was raging, but God opened doors for my wife, Toni, to attend Central Seminary via online classes. She came to know Pastor Dezo and others in the ABC Denomination, so we decided in August that year to give FBC a try and we have been here since.

My career is in commercial flight operations, and a job offer brought us here from Phoenix summer 2013. I work for private jet operator Airshare as a Mission Planner. We live in Grandview and have one adult daughter, Rebecca.

You may not be surprised to learn I have been in music my whole life, the youngest of five from gifted and well-loved teachers and ministers of music. My late sister, Sue Ellen, continued this in her work for children and youth, and my brother, Richard, was leader of the mid-80's band *Mr. Mister*.

I sang in the *Phoenix Boys Choir, even went on their first tour of Europe! I have produced two CD's of music for worship, and have been in more rock bands than I can count, including my local cover band Way Too Famous.*I've worked with some well known names, and have a few singing credits.



Music aside, I'm fascinated by the history surrounding the construction of Hoover Dam, near Las Vegas NV, and learned of Depression era families flocking to the desert southwest for work, finding only more hardship, exploitation, racism, hunger, heat and death in the midst of one of America's defining moments in engineering. A few years ago, I tried my hand at screenwriting and produced several drafts that I feel could make an amazing motion picture - a true story that most Americans don't know.

Back to music! My hobby is my YouTube channel Scoring Star Trek where we explore the music from the original Star Trek TV show. A benefit of studying this sophisticated music has been growing as a musician and composer. This was the impetus for composing Pastor Steve's Mary Magdalene story, as if these men whose work I've loved for decades were saying, "Okay, now it's your turn."

We love our Beloved Community, and I'm pleased to be part of the music ministry.


