OUR KIND OF BAPTIST!

I was going to write about a recent article I had just read that captured my imagination. But then, President Jimmy Carter died. Jimmy Carter was "our kind of Baptist." And he reminds us never to put Southern Baptists or evangelicals in a box, because they won't fit. They come in all stripes and colors.

I don't think anyone can argue that Jimmy Carter absolutely stood alone as the best ex-President our nation has ever produced. His Carter Presidential Center did more good than any other effort by all the other former Presidents combined. Jan loves to tell the story that we were volunteering at a Habitat for Humanity house-building project, and she was helping to install a second floor window, and looked across at the next house, also under Habitat construction, and there was Jimmy Carter also installing a window and flashing that incredible smile at Jan!

His work in eradication of Third World diseases, in monitoring elections to ensure they were fair in countless nations around the world, his teaching the adult Bible study class on Sunday mornings at his church in Plains, his advocacy for peacemaking, these are just some of his accomplishments. His faithfulness to his incredible wife, to his family, to the Plains community, and his incredible personal morality, these are just some of the things for which he will be remembered.

Jimmy Carter was a man of principles. He believed in the separation of church and state. He didn't want public school children mumbling some government-written prayer. He believed prayer belonged in the heart, of children, of everyone.

I've read a number of his books. I'll probably re-read or re-scan a few this week. Just to cherish Jimmy.

He was "our kind of Baptist," because he was forward-thinking, always elevating the role of women, and minorities, and immigrants, and anyone who was different in any way. He spoke at several ABC biennials and he worked hard to bring mainstream Baptists together.

I think I admire him most for the man he was. For his style of "manhood." For the way he modeled a gentler, humbler, but also determined way of being a man in this world.



Jimmy Carter: I loved you. I admired you so much. You were better suited as a former President. And you showed us all by your values that a decent man, an honorable man, a man of high values, a man of vision, a man of strong principles, can make such an incredible difference in your 100 years on this earth. Well, done, Jimmy. You have fought the good fight. You have run the race. You can kept the faith. And there is reserved for you a crown of righteousness.

ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS HYMNS

Why don't we sing Christmas carols throughout December? There are some of our most beloved songs and through much of Advent, we sing songs more unfamiliar. First, the pastors largely selected the first and last hymns of each service. During the first three Sundays of advent, when we are looking forward to the birth of Jesus, it is a period of expectancy and waiting. Thus, we sing advent songs that speak of looking ahead to the Christ child, hymns of expectancy. By the fourth Sunday of Advent, and Christmas Eve, and Christmas Sunday, and Epiphany Sunday, we sing the more familiar Christmas carols for by this time of the season, the period of waiting is over and now we celebrate what God has done through Christ! So, it's three Sundays of Advent/Expectancy Hymns and four worship times of Christmas carols. If we jump ahead toward the beginning of Advent and already begin to sing of the joy of Jesus' birth, we take away the season of waiting, of preparing, of expectancy.
