Filling Your Cup: Why Self-Care Matters

Last weekend, Last weekend, after a trip to Chicago with my family for my graduation, I expected to be exhausted after getting home on Saturday night. However, I was not. I woke up on Sunday morning full of energy. It did not sink in until after worship. As I sat down in a chair to talk with someone in the commons, I suddenly felt so tired that I could have fallen asleep right there! Now a few nights of rest later I see that I was so busy that I did not take the time to check in with myself to see how I was doing. I was so busy that I forgot about my need for selfcare. This experience brought to memory an article I wrote years ago about the importance of self care; now if I could just learn to call this to memory in the moment, I would be set!

Have you ever noticed what happens when your phone or tablet gets low on battery? The screen dims, a warning pops up, and we rush to plug it in. We know the device won't work well—or at all—if it's not recharged. And yet, many of us forget that we need the same kind of care.

What about your battery? Have you checked it lately? Some of us feel guilty taking time to rest. Some don't know how. And others are so busy—volunteering here or there, supporting and caring for family or friends, or just working hard on our projects we are invested in — often it feels that there's just no time. But friends, no matter our age or season of life, we all need moments to pause and refill. For those of you who like making lists, put self-care on your list or calendar to make sure you actually get to it.

So, what is self-care? Self-care is any activity that helps recharge your heart, mind, body, or soul. It's different for everyone. For some, it's walking outside and noticing the beauty of nature. For others, it might include quiet prayer, reading a good book, gardening, painting, or simply sitting still with a cup of tea. Even a few minutes a day can make a big difference.

If you've stopped doing something that once brought you joy or peace, maybe it's time to try it or make time for it again. And if you're volunteering or caring for others—your community, children, aging parents, friends in need—you especially need to care for yourself too. You can't pour from an empty cup.

Some of us may delay rest due to your inner critic or someone else who is pushing for more. Rest assured that rest is not laziness, it's wisdom. Even Jesus knew the importance of rest. Luke 5:16 tells us that Jesus "often withdrew to lonely places and prayed." If Jesus needed quiet time to connect with God and be restored, how much more do we?

Taking a break doesn't mean you're doing something wrong. It means you're preparing to do what's right—better and with strength. Whether you're 5 or 95, your body and spirit need rest to thrive. As a mom of young children, I can testify to the need for rest, both for myself and for my little ones. Whenever our children get enough sleep, we can immediately tell the difference in their behavior.

Rest can take on many forms for each of us. It can be as simple as taking 15 minutes during your day to breathe deeply, pray, or listen to uplifting music. Even a short moment can be holy. As I mentioned in my feeling ...

...exhausted this past Sunday, I rushed home Sunday and took a good 20 minute nap and I felt recharged. It did not require much, just a short nap.

What happens if we don't rest? Eventually, we'll run out of energy—and maybe in the middle of something really important. Our health, our relationships, our work, and even our faith can suffer when we're running on empty. Let us take care of ourselves before it's forced upon us. So, let's make space.

Take the next 30 seconds to make a game plan for you to rest today or in the next few days. It may include replacing a scroll through social media with a few minutes of prayer or stillness. Let's let go of guilt and embrace God's gift of Sabbath rest. Selfcare matters Let's remind one another, at every age, that caring for ourselves is not selfish—it's faithful.

When we are rested, we are better able to love, serve, and live fully. Be well.

Guys. And then, to be honest, at that point, I would be pretty tired, and I would probably just want to go home. I think a day is just too short, considering the time that is wanted to decompress.




