When Life Catches Us Off Guard

One moment we are simply going about our day. Then, suddenly, something happens that shakes us: a phone call, a diagnosis, a loss, a conflict, an unexpected bill, a misunderstanding, or even something as unsettling as learning that scammers are pretending to be us.

That kind of experience can feel deeply personal. It is disturbing to know that someone would use our name, our reputation, our relationships, or the trust we have built with others in order to deceive people.

On Tuesday, April 28, 2026, I had just finished Bible study, and someone had come into my office for a meeting. Just as we were beginning, there was a knock at my door. It was my colleague Pastor Megan. She asked, "Did you just send me a text from another phone number?" At that moment, we realized something had happened.

Our office manager soon discovered that scammers pretending to be a church member had gained access to our church directory. Once they did, they began texting church members while pretending to be me (Pastor Dezo), asking for gift cards for cancer patients.

When I learned what had happened, I felt helpless. I felt the weight of knowing that I could not protect our church members from that message before it reached them. It especially grieves me to know that scammers may now have contact information for people I love and serve. But I am very thankful that Pastor Megan quickly reached out to most of you and an email was sent out right away to let you know of what had happened, but the damage was already done.

It breaks my heart that anyone would use trust, compassion, and the name of the church to take advantage of others. But this is also the world we live in today, and moments like this remind us that we must be both faithful and watchful.

Jesus told his disciples to be "wise as serpents and innocent as doves" (Matthew 10:16). That is a good word for us. We are called to remain loving, generous, and compassionate, but we are also called to be careful.

So please, be watchful. If you receive an email, text message, phone call, or piece of mail that appears to be from me, a church member, or anyone connected to the church, and something feels unusual, please contact us directly. You know the church phone number. Many of you know my number. Please do not hesitate to double-check. It is always better to ask than to be taken advantage of.

When life catches us off guard, God is not caught off guard. God gives us wisdom, courage, and community. We do not face these moments alone. We look out for one another. We warn one another. We protect one another. We pray for one another.

May God protect each of you. May God guard our church family from harm. And may God even change the hearts of those who seek to deceive others. May the scammers find something better to do with their lives, and may grace lead them toward truth.

In a world where trust can be misused, may we continue to be a people of love, wisdom, and care.

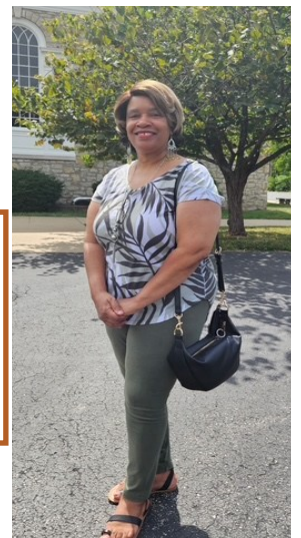

Spotlight on Maybelle "Jerry" Logan



Maybelle Rose Logan was born on May 9, 1924, in Santa Ana, California, to Herdie Lee Gray and Lena Ann Jones Gray. To her family, she was lovingly known as Jerry. On December 14, 1940, she married the love of her life, John Joseph Logan. Together they shared 32 years of marriage, raised three children—James, John, and Joyce. She enjoyed traveling the country, visiting national parks, camping, and hiking. Maybelle lived in Kansas City for many years before later moved to Las Vegas.

Maybelle had a beautiful gift for staying connected. She never joined another church in her life. The Beloved Community of First Baptist Church was the only church she ever called home. Even after moving away, she continued to support the church, read the newsletter faithfully, and remain connected to the life of the congregation. Even at 100 years old, she sent a card thanking Pastor Dezo for an article she had written in the newsletter.



During World War II, Maybelle proudly served as one of the original "Rosie the Riveters," working on the bomb bay section of B-52 bombers. She later built a successful career as an accountant, beginning at Helzberg Jewelers and later working as an auditor for the IRS, where she eventually retired.



Maybelle was full of life. She lived by herself until she was 101 years old. She loved game shows and enjoyed the challenge of playing along to keep her mind sharp. She was independent, humorous, generous, and adventurous. For her 90th birthday, she took a solo road trip across the country to visit family, traveling from Las Vegas to Texas, Kansas, Colorado, and beyond. She kept her cash tucked safely in a Bible in the trunk. Her car did not have a stereo, so she sang "Onward Christian Soldiers" along the way. She truly was a force to be reckoned with.

Maybelle was known in her family as the "kinkeeper." She never forgot a birthday, anniversary, or holiday. She faithfully sent cards and gifts to her grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great-grandchildren. One great-grandchild shared, "Even at 40 years old, she still sent me \$10 and a card for every birthday and holiday." That simple act reflected the love, care, and generosity that marked her life.



Maybelle is survived by her daughter, Joyce N. Stivers, and son-in-law, Steve Stivers; her daughter-in-law, Chris Logan; her grandchildren, Jim Logan, David Logan, Greg Logan, Kalyynn Amundson, Bryan Amundson, John Logan, and Ryan Logan; and many great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren.

We give thanks for Maybelle's life, her faithfulness, her generosity, her adventurous spirit, and her deep love for family and church. May her memory be a blessing to all of us.

It was such an honor to do her graveside service. Maybelle would have been 102 years old on May 9th. Happy First Heavenly Birthday, Maybelle!

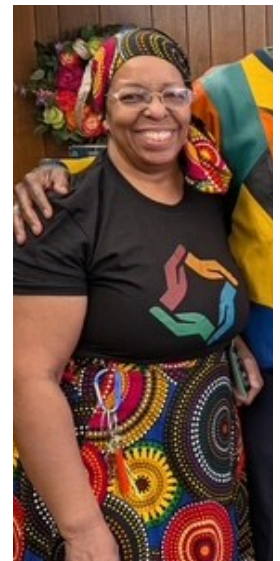

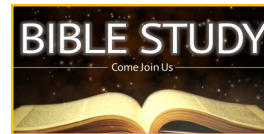
