## A Sign of Hope and A Call to Action

This is my second week back to work, and it feels so good to be back. I look forward to reconnecting with each of you over the coming weeks. I want to begin this article by thanking all of you for your prayers, care, and support throughout this pregnancy. During the ten weeks I spent in the hospital, as I awaited the birth of Flora and Grace, your prayers and support kept me going. I am thankful to serve such a caring and loving church. I would especially like to affirm your intentional care that you showed to me and that you consistently show each other and those in our communities.

In reflection on my last few months, I feel strongly that the birth of a child (or children) is one of the most profound and awe-inspiring experiences in life. Whether it is a family welcoming a new baby through childbirth or adoption, it is such a profound experience to see this young life welcomed into the world. Five weeks ago, I gave birth to our twin girls, Flora and Grace. The weeks and months leading up to their birth were full of uncertainties and fears. Due to the twins being mono-mono, which is the rarest identical twins, our doctors shared the risks related to their umbilical cords not being protected by separate sacs, and thus they could become tangled and cause harm to one or both babies. No matter how much I tried to stay calm and hopeful, the fear was always there. Yet, once they were born, all the fear disappeared. Seeing their little faces brought me so much joy and hope. Birth reminds us that even in the darkest times, new beginnings await. Birth is the beginning of new possibilities, a fresh start, and an unmistakable sign of hope.

Their birth also reminds me of the responsibility and obligation we have to create an environment relevant to our children. With birth comes an inherent responsibility to nurture, protect, and empower the life that has just begun. The sense of responsibility accompanying new life ignites hope for a better world but also calls us to action. To safeguard the future of each new generation, we must commit to building safe, equitable, and sustainable communities.

As we witness new births, we are reminded of our duty to care not just for our household but also for the planet, to pursue justice, and to foster compassion. Birth is an opportunity to make the world a place that upholds the values of love, respect, and kindness. It is a reminder to prioritize the well-being of others, to take care of ourselves and our surroundings, and to strive for continuous improvement, ensuring that the seeds of hope we plant today will grow into the pillars of tomorrow.

In closing, birth is more than just the arrival of new life, it is the embodiment of hope, renewal, and our future. May we feel encouraged to do our part to prepare the best future environment in our church and in our community for this next generation.

# Spotlight on Rev. Toni Page

I have been at FBC since the summer of 2021. After COVID hit and during seminary, my husband and I found ourselves uncomfortable and unwelcome at our previous church. My theology had changed significantly from theirs, and their response to COVID was disheartening. We found ourselves spiritually homeless. We are so thankful to have found FBC, KCMO. We have been so graciously received.

I am the oldest of three girls. My mother, my dad, and I are all left-handed. When I was younger, we liked to tent camp a lot. After moving to Arizona, we didn't camp much. I was born with a heart defect. However, I did well and did not require much maintenance. However, when I had my daughter, Rex, I went into congestive heart failure. I was in this condition for 7 years. Then, in 1996, I contracted whooping cough. This caused my heart to begin failing in earnest. I needed a heart transplant. On October 7<sup>th</sup>, 1997, I got my donated heart. I have a few bumps along the way. I have a pacemaker, and I've had to have a valve replaced. Otherwise, I've been doing great!



I met my husband, David, in Arizona. We have lived in California, Colorado, Minnesota (for my heart transplant), Iowa, Arizona, and Missouri. I have had several home multi-level marketing businesses. Mary Kay was my most successful, but I never earned a car. I am a lifelong Vikings fan, but I love the Chiefs. The Chiefs are my secondary team.

I spent many years working as a church Synagogue secretary. My recent chaplain residency was my first full-time job since before Rex was born.

If I had a whole day to myself and if the budget was unlimited, I would go shopping, see a movie, and eat lunch and dinner out. I love science fiction books, movies, and TV shows. It's no secret that David and I are Star Trek fans. I've watched every Star Trek movie and show created except for the cartoons. I collect shot glasses. I love the smell of books.

My favorite classes at seminary were Theology and Biblical Interpretation. I like philosophy.

I am an Enneagram Nine and dislike conflict. I practice avoidance as much as possible.

I love horseback riding. I have also done beading, created T-shirts, and made jewelry out of old, discarded pieces. I did several kinds of handicrafts when I was raising my daughter ex on Disability.

I am a big fan of David Gilmore of Pink Floyd. I also love classical music, Blues, Classic Rock, and Way Too Famous! Guilty pleasure? Some heavy metal rock.
