Have you Noticed?

I want to begin by saying thank you. Thank you to each of you who are faithfully praying for our church. Thank you for your unwavering financial support. Thank you for showing up in ways both big and small that are making a real difference. Your love and faithfulness do not go unnoticed, and they are part of what God is using to keep this church strong.

This past Sunday after worship, I noticed a member quietly working behind the communion table. Curious, I asked, "What are you doing?" He explained that whenever he watched the service online, he noticed microphone and audio cables scattered on the floor. In just a few minutes, he transformed a messy space into a clean and orderly one. What struck me most was that no one asked him. He simply saw a need and stepped in. He saw something, and he did something. That's how God works through us.

Not long ago, I had a conversation with another member about the many blessings God is bringing forth in our congregation. She shared how grateful she was that our church is still going strong in these challenging times. As we talked about rising costs everywhere, she paused and said, "I need to increase my giving to the church. I can do better. I am going to do that right away." That moment moved me deeply. She saw the faithfulness of God and wanted to respond with faithfulness of her own. She saw something, and she did something.

A few weeks back, during our church workdays, I watched two volunteers trimming bushes and pulling weeds. It was hot, hard, tiring work. I remember thinking, "This is a lot for just a few people." Later that same day, a family from the church called me and said, "Pastor, we'd like to bring our landscaper to give a bid for the church grounds." By the very next day, they had gone beyond that and generously offered to cover the full cost of the landscaping. What a beautiful example of generosity flowing straight from the heart. They saw something, and they did something. I could list 20 more stories like these that took place in the past few months. I love how you all are noticing something and doing something about it.

Do you notice the pattern? Time and again, God is stirring hearts. People are noticing, responding, and stepping in. These are not just "good deeds," these are holy moments. These are glimpses of the Spirit at work in our church.

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:19)

Friends, God is indeed doing something new among us. We see it in acts of generosity, in prayers lifted, in quiet service, in bold giving, and in the way, people are stepping forward to lighten the load for one another. Every time you notice a need, every time you offer your gifts, every time you pray for the mission of this church, you are joining God in God's work of renewal.

So, let's keep our eyes open. Let's keep noticing. Let's keep stepping in with joy. Together, we are part of God's new thing, right here, right now, and the best is yet to come.

Growing up, she attended segregated schools and remembers how 27th Street marked the boundary for Black families. Those early challenges shaped her strength and outlook on life.



She went on to work more than 25 years for the Internal Revenue Service as a tax examiner. Alongside her career, she has always carried a love for art. She once won a prize for her artwork at the downtown Emery Bird Thayer store. Though she doesn't draw as often as she once did, her love for creativity remains part of who she is. She has some beautiful art pieces at her home that she has drawn.

Music is another passion, especially Black spirituals. One of Roberta's favorites is James Cleveland's "Give Me My Flowers." Its message, honoring people while they are alive, speaks deeply to her. She also enjoys traveling, having visited Houston, Milwaukee, Los Angeles, and other places.

Something that most people might not know is that there is an opera singer in her family. Also, our beloved member Pat Hester is her cousin.

Now 92 years young, Roberta feels blessed to be in good health. Although she no longer drives, she faithfully attends worship online each week. "It's a blessing to have the internet," she says, "but it's nothing like being at church in person." Her hope is that more people will come back to worship together. In the meantime, she is committed to supporting the church financially and prays for its continued flourishing.

When asked who inspires her, she immediately points to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., whose courage and sacrifice opened doors for so many. And when asked how she would like to be remembered, her answer is simple: "As a person concerned about other people."

We give thanks for Roberta's faith, her wisdom, and her example. What a gift she is to our church family!
