REFLECTIONS

The legislation in Numbers 5-6 yields a comprehensive vision for the life of God's newly established covenant community, a life portrayed as *coram deo*, lived before the face of YHWH, whereby YHWH himself is deeply involved in every relationship and dealing. As such, the purity laws function as paradigms for the life of Israel's Camp, setting forth a theology for life as YHWH's people. Well beyond concerns with ritual defilement, these laws call for behavior such as confession of sin regarding one's neighbor, fidelity within one's marriage, and selfless, sacrificial devotion to YHWH God. Since the behavior solicited by the purity laws is paradigmatic for Israel's Camp, failing to live by these ideals makes one unfit for the Camp, leading to expulsion from its bounds.



Then in the same way, after supper Jesus took the Cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.


▼ Coming to the Table


