REFLECTIONS

The punctuation in this passage really matters. Verse 3 is often read incorrectly as, “A voice of one calling in the wilderness: ‘Prepare the way for the LORD’”, as if the bit about the wilderness is merely a geographical footnote helping to geolocate the voice. But no! The message of the voice is actually this: “In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD.” In other words, the wilderness is where I should go looking for God! This is where he’s coming. John the Baptist understood this, choosing to dwell in the desert and to prepare there for the arrival of the Messiah.

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the LORD’s hand double for all her sins. A voice cries: “In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.”

Isaiah 40:1-5

John’s stark warnings set the tone for much of the story of Jesus. John prepared the way, not knowing what it would actually look like when God’s kingdom arrived; and John was himself puzzled at the outcome (Mt. 11.2-6). Jesus’ own mission was quite different from what people sometimes imagine; the comfort and healing of his kingdom-message was balanced by the stern and solemn warning that when God comes back he demands absolute allegiance. If God really is God, he isn’t simply the kindly, indulgent, easy-going parent we sometimes imagine.

Israel has been back in the land for several centuries, but at the same time they have not seen the complete fulfillment of the promises of return. Now they are going to see that. They are still in exile not because they are under the dominion of Rome but because they are under a much worse oppression. When the Pharisees and Sadducees come to John, he addresses them as a brood of vipers, children of the devil not children of Abraham. Israel, especially her leaders, is under the dominion of the devil (John 8). Israel must prepare for the coming of Yahweh and for the end of exile. [John] baptizes in the wilderness (v.1) and at the Jordan (v.5) because his baptism ritually enacts that return; those baptized by John cross the Jordan from exile back into the land (cf. Ezekiel 36).

Pastor: And it was in mercy towards us that our heavenly Father gave his only Son to suffer death on the Cross for our redemption.

As it is written: On the night Christ was betrayed he took Bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, “This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” Then in the same way, after supper Jesus took the Cup, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.” For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

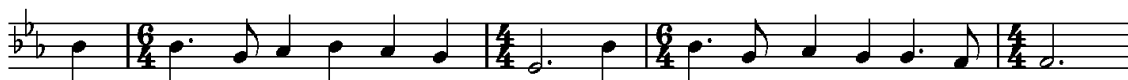

Dr. Kelsey Kreyche

You are invited to pray for one of our members, Dr. Kelsey Kreyche, who will be serving at Hospital Loma De Luz in Honduras Feb 18 -March 12, May 12-28, and Aug 4 -27. At this local Christian hospital that partners with Samaritan's Purse, Kelsey will serve as a physician alongside Honduran and ex-pat providers. Her role will include care for inpatients, outpatients, ER/Trauma, and night coverage. She will also serve as a Consultant and Educator to the local physicians, which invests into this community beyond her length of stay. Her hope is that God will use these trips to further His Kingdom work and enrich her love for the Lord.



How to pray for Kelsey:

- Pray for God's continued work in using Hospital Loma De Luz as a means of the love and ministry of Jesus Christ in Honduras.
- Supply chain is constantly vulnerable to political changes, regional powers (narcos), and international influences. While we have historically operated despite this, disruptions are more frequent so we are trying to source more from WITHIN Honduras. Pray for these new sources, relationships, and resources we must import.
- With rainy season ending, Hospital LDL will host many visiting medical missionaries this spring/summer. Pray that local and foreign missionaries will be filled with the grace of God, spiritual encouragement, and holiness.
- God's continued favor on the many logistics, Kelsey's health, and her partnership as a physician at Hospital LDL.
