REFLECTIONS

What the priests did when they entered the tabernacle was a kind of *pre*-enactment of the ascension. We often talk about re-enactments... What we have in the tabernacle was a *pre*-enactment – a copy of an event still to come that communicated something of what the ascension would involve:

- Moses is the mediator between God and His people; Jesus is the true mediator between God and His people.
- Moses ascends up a mountain into the clouds; Jesus ascends through the clouds into heaven itself.
- Moses is shown a copy of the heavenly tabernacle which he replicates on earth; Jesus ascends to enter the real thing, the heavenly tabernacle.
- The priest comes before God through the blood of sacrifice; Jesus ascends to come before God on our behalf through His own sacrificial blood.
- The priest comes into God's presence through a cloud of incense; Jesus passes through the clouds of heaven.
- The priest comes before God bearing jewels that represent the names of God's people; Jesus ascends to come before God on our behalf and in our names.

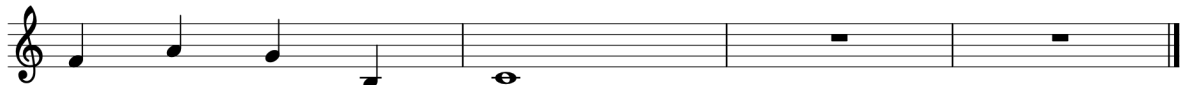

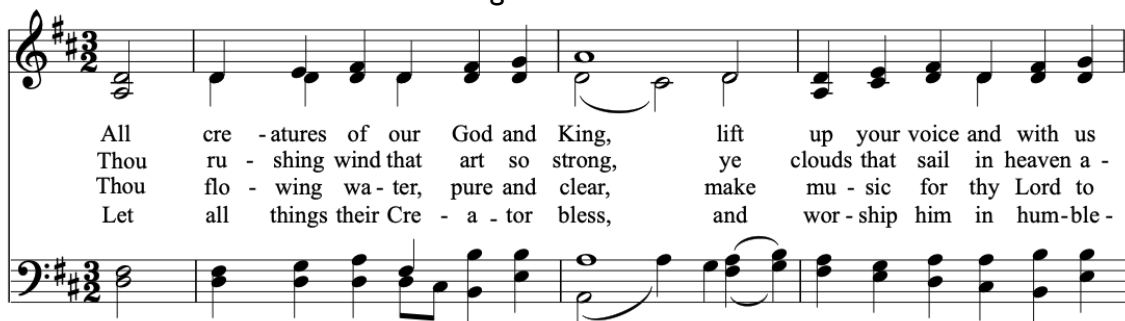

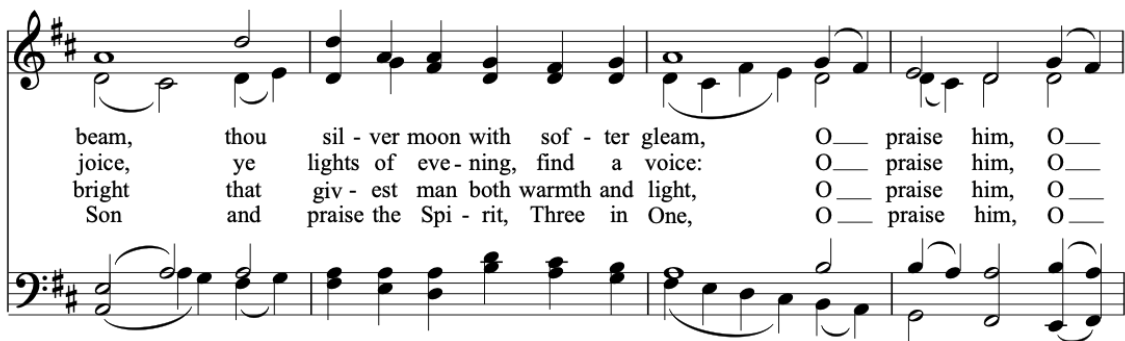

Then Peter came up and said to him, “Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?” Jesus said to him, “I do not say to you seven times, but seventy-seven times.

Pastor: And it was in mercy towards us that our heavenly Father gave his only Son to suffer death on the Cross for our redemption.

As it is written: On the night Christ was betrayed he took Bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, “This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” Then in the same way, after supper Jesus took the Cup, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.” For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

You will be invited forward up the center aisle and you will return down the outside aisle. If you are unable to come to the front to take communion, remain in your seat and it will be brought to you. The bread is homemade and gluten free. Wine is in the clear cups and grape juice is in the purple cups.

If you are not eating the Supper with us today, you may come forward with your hands clasped together to receive prayer, or you may spend this time in prayer at your seat using the communion prayers printed in the back of the bulletin. We welcome our children to come forward to the Table for prayer (see *Children and Communion at the back of this order of worship*).

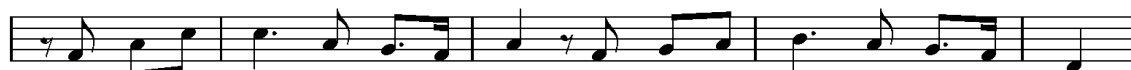
