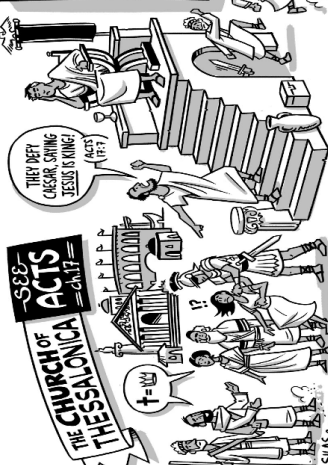

Pastor: And it was in mercy towards us that our heavenly Father gave his only Son to suffer death on the Cross for our redemption.

As it is written: On the night Christ was betrayed he took Bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, “This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” Then in the same way, after supper Jesus took the Cup, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.” For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

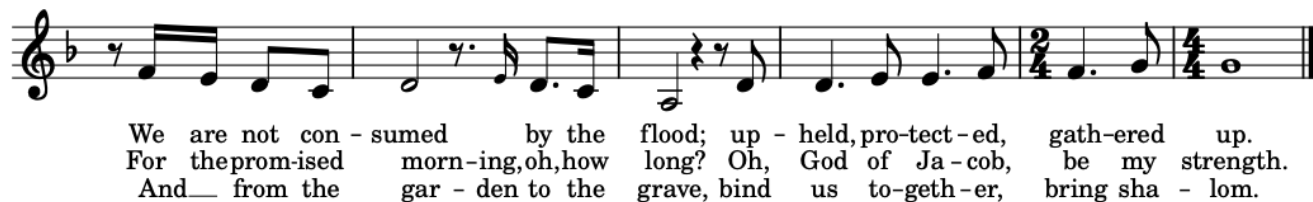
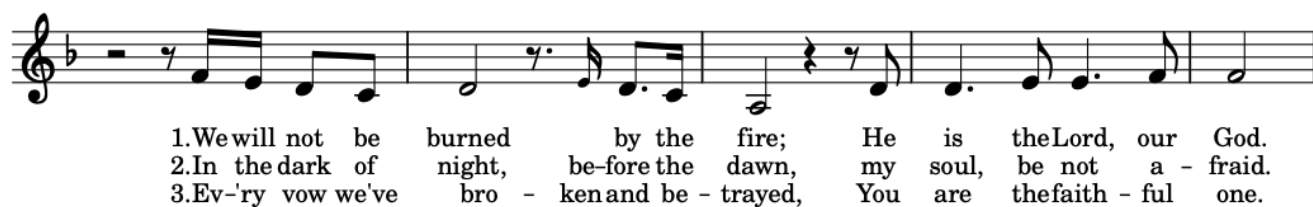
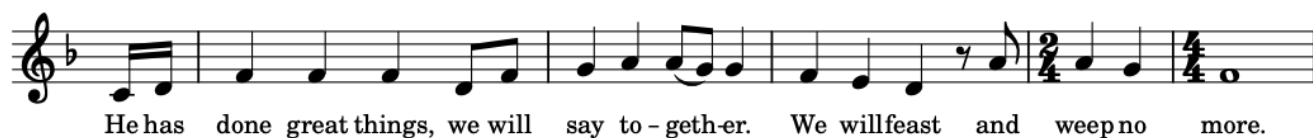

Wheatland Missionary Spotlight

Jeff & Kasia Newswanger and Daniel Carroll traveling to Poland: July 31- August 15

Jeff & Kasia Newswanger, along with Daniel Carroll, are heading to Poland to serve alongside their friends in Christ there. On Sunday Aug 2, they will worship with dear friends at Kościół Droga Życia (Word of Life Church) in Otwock where Jeff will preach. On Monday, they head south into the mountains where they will meet Pastor Pawel Kugler, 20 young people and a few workers from the state orphanage. An 8-day camp filled with hiking, swimming and exploring will follow. Chapel is held every morning and evening, with music lead by Kasia, Jeff, Daniel and Pawel, while Jeff and Daniel teach from Ephesians 3. The goal is to befriend these young people, live out Christ's love in front of them and encourage them in faith and love of Christ. After camp, the team will travel to the north of Poland to spend time with children who are in the orphanage, but are too young for the hiking camp.

The team would like to thank the church for their financial contribution from the Missions Team and asks everyone to join in praying for their projects and for Christ's church in Poland.
